Reiseplan

Day 1: Arrival in Cairo, Check-In

Your final destination is <u>Cairo International Airport</u>, where you will be met by one of our representatives holding a sign carrying your name. He or she will drive you to your hotel, where you will check in and meet your Egyptologist tour guide who will accompany you on your 12 Days Wheelchair Accessible Tours to Cairo, The Nile, and Hurghada. Everything is going according to plan. Overnight in Cairo.

Welcome Drink.

Day 2: Giza Pyramids, Saqqara Necropolis

After breakfast today, take a fantastic tour of the <u>Giza Pyramids</u> to experience ancient Egyptian architecture! The Great Pyramid, the Pyramid of Khafre, and the Pyramid of Menkaure, as well as the Great Sphinx, can all be found in Egypt. All were constructed between 2600 and 2500 BC, during the Fourth Dynasty of the Old Kingdom of Egypt.

where you can see the Great Pyramid of Cheops, which is made of more than 3 million stone blocks and is regarded as an engineering marvel, the Pyramid of Chephren, which is a little smaller but no less significant, and the Pyramid of Mycerinus, who held the Egyptian throne for a time during the same 4th dynasty, in addition to the Great Sphinx and the Valley Temple of King Chephren, where his royal body was preserved through the practice of religious mummification.

Then, we'll go to <u>Saqqara Necropolis</u> to see King Zoser's distinctive Step Pyramid, which was built with six steps stacked one atop the other. The area was rebuilt thanks to the efforts of a French archaeologist. We will visit the <u>Teti Pyramid</u> and the tomb of Kagemni, who was the husband of his daughter, to see the magnificent depictions of everyday life that were carved in supremacy. After enjoying a delicious lunch in a high-class establishment, you will have the rest of the day free to explore Cairo on one of our day trips there or spend time in your hotel. Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 3: Fly to Aswan, Aswan Excursions

Check out of the hotel after breakfast, and you'll be taken to the airport early this morning for a brief internal flight to Aswan. You will be taken to your five-star Aswan to Luxor Nile cruise after arriving. We will visit The High Dam in Aswan in 1960 and 1970, one of the largest embankment dams in the world was constructed in Aswan, Egypt, across the Nile. And begin our Aswan excursions after a little rest.

where the tour guide will discuss how the construction of the dam and the subsequent creation of Lake Nasser required the relocation of the Nubian population and some significant landmarks, including the Abu Simbel Temples. The village of Abu Simbel, which is close to the Sudanese border, is home to the historic Abu Simbel, which consists of two enormous rock-cut temples. It is located on the western shore of Lake Nasser, 300 kilometers (190 miles) by road southwest of Aswan. When Ramesses II was pharaoh of the 19th Dynasty in the 13th century BC, the twin temples were first hewn out of the mountainside.

which, as an optional excursion, you'll have the chance to see tomorrow. To see the <u>Temple of Philae</u>, we'll take a short boat ride to Agilkia Island. The temple was built during the Ptolemaic period and honors the goddess Isis.

The Unfinished Obelisk, which is believed to have been built during the reign of Queen Hatshepsut, will once again be on display at the granite quarries for our viewing pleasure. returning and spending the night on the cruise ship in Aswan.

Day 4: Kom Ombo and Edfu Temples

Today, you have the option of joining our optional trip from Aswan to the magnificent Abu Simbel temples, which are located between Egypt and Sudan. Ramses II of the 18th dynasty is credited with building the greatest monument in the new kingdom, which is recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Start by going to the Kom Ombo Temple, a dual temple honoring the gods of the falcon and the crocodile. It was constructed during the Ptolemaic dynasty, 180–47 BC.

We'll spend some time exploring the temple before moving on to Edfu. This temple, which is over 2,000 years old and is also dedicated to <u>Horus</u>, the patron god of kingship, was completely buried in the sand until the French campaign rediscovered it in 1798. Due to being hidden for so long, it is Egypt's best-preserved temple. The 5-star cruise ship will take us to Luxor where we will continue sailing and spend the night.

Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 5: Luxor West Bank Tours

Today, we'll start our Luxor day tours with a trip to the well-known <u>Valley of the Kings</u>, Also known as the Valley of the Gates of the Kings is a region in Egypt where, for nearly 500 years from the Eighteenth Dynasty to the Twentieth Dynasty, the Eighteenth Dynasty was the ruling dynasty. where you can visit some of the amazing tombs of the New Kingdom pharaohs, including King

Tutankhamun. The Temple of Hatshepsut (El Deir El Bahary Temple), the mortuary temple of the first recorded queen in ancient Egypt history who ruled Egypt during the new kingdom, will then be the next highlight of our trip. The grand <u>Colossi of Memnon</u>, the final remnants of the temple of Amenophis III, will be visited to cap off the day. Once again, spend the night on the cruise ship. Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 6: Luxor East Bank Tours

We will arrive in Luxor after breakfast and begin the incredible East Bank of Luxor tours. Learn about the magnificent Karnak temple, which was once a part of Thebes. It is devoted to <u>Amun</u>, the ruthless ram-headed god, and features a wide variety of temples, chapels, statues, and obelisks. The area around Karnak was considered by the ancient Egyptians to be "The Most Selected of Places" and the center of worship for the Amun-headed 18th Dynastic Theban Triad.

The temple of Luxor, which is dedicated to the triad of Amun, his wife Mut, and his son Khonso, will then be examined. It is a place of worship connected to the <u>Karnak Temple</u> by a lengthy avenue of sphinxes. Together, these temples and gods had a significant impact on the annual Great Opet Festival that took place during the flood season. On the Red Sea's coast, in Hurghada, we will stay in an all-inclusive resort after taking a private air-conditioned vehicle there. Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 7: Optional Snorkeling Trip in Hurghada

You can entertain yourself at your leisure on this day off. The Hurghada resort offers a sizable pool, extensive sandy beaches, and all-inclusive food and drink. You're about to experience complete relaxation! However, you can choose to partake in any of the water sports activities, such as our magnificent Hurghada snorkeling tours and scuba diving. You can see numerous species of vibrant fish in the seas surrounding Hurghada, which have some of the best coral reef diving locations in the world. Stay the night at a resort in Hurghada.

Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 8: Optional Hurghada Bedouin Desert Safari by Jeep

You have two choices today: unwind in the resort or take advantage of one of Hurghada's most incredible activities, the Hurghada Desert Safari Trip, and experience desert life alongside the native Bedouins of the Red Sea and the eastern desert of Egypt.

Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 9: Optional Sindbad Submarine Trip in Hurghada

You will have the chance to try our <u>Sinbad submarine in Hurghada</u> after your resort's buffet breakfast because it is the only one in the Middle East that can descend 22 meters below the surface of the

water to view colorful coral reefs and beautiful fish species.

Included Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Day 10: Fly to Cairo

Today, we will transfer to the <u>Hurghadah International Airport</u> in our air-conditioned private vehicle in preparation for our flight back to Cairo. Upon arrival, you will be privately transferred to your hotel in Cairo where you can check in and unwind. Alternatively, you can reserve one of our Cairo trips, such as a posh dinner cruise to experience Cairo at night.

Day 11: Egyptian Museum, Khan El Khalili

Following a delicious breakfast at the hotel, we will begin our visit to <u>The Egyptian Museum</u>, located in <u>Cairo</u>, <u>Egypt</u>, which houses the largest collection of <u>Egyptian</u> antiquities in the world. You will be amazed by the quantity of artifacts on display there. After a delicious lunch, you will visit Cairo's Islamic neighborhood to explore <u>Khan El Khalili</u>, a bazaar brimming with gift shops. You can relax with a tea mint in one of the neighborhood cafes or explore the area to see the stunningly lit Islamic structures that are typically seen during trips to Cairo for Muslims.
