Al Alamein Military Museum, located in the historical area south of the international road, is an important destination for tourists and visitors from within Egypt and from Arab and foreign countries, especially nationals of the countries that participated in the Battle of Alamein, which was the beginning of the end of the Second World War, in addition to those looking for ancient and modern historical fun and culture.

The Commonwealth Cemetery is the only cemetery in the world that brings together the remains of people of the three monotheistic religions in a single cemetery: 'Here the Muslim lies next to the Christian and the Jew,' as it includes large areas that can accommodate thousands of remains of soldiers, officers, children, and women.
