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Luxor

Explore the city of Luxor through our tours that we offer. The Arabs gave the city of Luxor this name because of its many palaces and temples at the time of the Islamic conquest of Egypt. Through our tours, you will have the opportunity to visit East Luxor and one of its most important temples, the Luxor Temple: This temple was built for the purpose of worshipping the god Amun, built by the pharaohs, and Ramses II built two statues to represent him seated.

You will visit Karnak temple complex: A group of beautiful temples, built thousands of years ago, the temples include statues of the god Amun, his wife and his son, and Karnak is called the fortress.

You will then be transferred to the West Bank to enjoy its mind-blowing monuments such as the tombs, Valley of the Kings and Valley of the Queens, They are huge, large, eye-catching temples built in memory of the most famous pharaohs of their time, such as the Ramsesium Temple, which bears the name of Ramses II with its columns and inscriptions that tell stories about his exploits, especially the Battle of Kadesh and his victory over the Hittites.

Then you will be able to see the two giant statues of Memnon: Located on the west bank of the Nile, they are two huge stone statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep III, who ruled Egypt during the Eighteenth Dynasty (around 1350 BC).

The last site of the day is a visit to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, which was built by the queen to monitor the history of her rule over the country, which represented the height of prosperity and prosperity in the Pharaonic civilisation.

You will be met by our driver and accompanied by your guide from Luxor Airport or from in front of your hotel in Luxor to visit the East Bank first, such as Karnak Temple, which was built by King "Ramses III", the second king of the Twentieth Dynasty in 1198 BC, then increased by his son "Ramses IV", then "Ramses XI", and finally completed by "Hrehor" the high priest who became king "Pharaoh". Then you will be transferred to Luxor Temple to explore this ancient temple You will be taken to a local restaurant in Luxor to enjoy a delicious Egyptian lunch

after that we will continue our trip to the West Bank You will visit several famous places there such as the Valley of the Kings The story of choosing this valley as a place to bury kings is worth telling, Thutmose I (1540 - 1501 BC), the third pharaoh of the 18th Dynasty, wished to preserve his body and keep it safe from robbers by selecting his grave in a remote valley behind Thebes' rocks.

Then we will go to the Bahari Monastery, which is known as the funerary temple of Hatshepsut, after that we will visit the two statues of Memnon and return to King Amenhotep III, then you will be transferred to Luxor Airport or your hotel in Luxor.
