Abu Simbel:

A phenomenon that has been going on for tens of centuries... the sun perpendicular to the face of the statue of Ramses II twice a year: the first on October 22 and the second on February 22 and that explains how intelligent were the ancient Egyptians.

the High Dam:

Following the July Revolution of 1952, Adrian Daninos, an Egyptian engineer of Greek origin, presented Nasser with the idea of constructing a dam in the Aswan region on the southern borders of Egypt in order to impound the Nile waters to prevent flooding and to collect water for irrigation and power generation necessary for Egypt's growth and transition them to the age of industry.
