Itinerary

Day 1: arrive Siwa.

To give yourself enough time to tour Siwa before going to night and preparing for the following day, you will depart from Cairo early in the morning to begin your journey to the Siwa oasis. At 5 am (or later if you choose), your tour guide will pick you up and begin driving to Siwa. You will go through Alexandria to Marsa Matrouh, where you will eat lunch adjacent to the Mediterranean Sea, which is particularly remarkable owing to its astonishing colour variation. It is said that Cleopatra herself dipped her toes in Marsa Matrouh's serene waters.

After that, continue driving to the <u>Siwa oasis</u>, arriving there just before dusk (depends on the traffic). After supper, you may unwind, take a walk, catch the beginning of a performance, or spend the rest of the evening watching Siwa in the city centre.

Day 2: Siwa oasis safari trip

After witnessing an incredibly peaceful sunrise, you'll eat breakfast and get ready for a visit of El Dakroor Mountain before leaving for a safari.

Following that, you embark on a Jeep safari expedition into the desert to escape the stress of daily life. Your safari guides will take you on an expedition through the expansive sand dunes and deep within the expansive sand in a 44 Jeep.

One must observe the extraordinary desert fauna and vegetation. We'll also allow you to go dunking and sandboarding in addition to lots of other entertaining activities! We will offer our skills so that you can make the most of your camera and document the most memorable parts of your journey to the Siwa desert. Sit down for a delectable dessert Bedouin supper adjacent bir wahed with regionally inspired decor.

We'll then travel there. The salt that is taken from the salt lakes in Siwa has therapeutic and stressrelieving properties. The saline in the lakes is said to have natural therapeutic benefits for the skin, sinuses, and eyes, in addition to making it easier to read a book while floating on your back and relaxing your entire body. As a result, Siwa is today predominantly supported by the recreational and medical tourism sectors. The hot and cold springs of <u>Bir Wahed</u> were unintentionally found.

Little more than a few kilometres apart, slowly growing in the middle of <u>the Great Sand Sea</u>. People travel from all over the world to the Oasis only for the purpose of cooling off in the freshwater pool after soaking in the naturally occuring hot springs; it is an inexpensive and all-natural form of therapy.

Go to the <u>Cleopatra Spring</u>, a rocky pool that receives frigid freshwater from a neighbouring spring. so that you can dip into that lovely water to relax and recharge for the day. One of the highlights of your Siwa oasis expedition to the big sand sea will be viewing an amazing desert sunset while ambling around barefoot. Additionally, this spring is flanked by magnificent green palm trees. When you arrive, savour a barbecue meal, grilled meats, crisp salads, delectable Siwian food, coffee, and dates in a camp designed in the Bedouin manner.

Day3: Historical sities in siwa

After breakfast, we'll head to your hotel to relax before heading out for lunch. One of the pleasures of your Siwa oasis excursion to the wide sand sea is walking on the dunes in your bare feet while admiring a spectacular desert sunset. When you arrive, savour a barbecue meal, grilled meats, crisp salads, delectable Siwian food, coffee, and dates in a camp designed in the Bedouin manner.

The <u>Mountain of the Dead</u>, also known as (Gabal Elmwata), is a tiny hill at the northernmost part of Siwa Town that is covered in breathtaking wall paintings and honeycombed with rock graves. Gebel al-Mawta, also referred to as the "Mountain of the Dead," is where it is located. Along with the Ptolemaic and Roman eras, the 26th dynasty was responsible for the majority of the tomb construction in this region. The Siwans took sanctuary in these tombs when the Italians assaulted the oasis in World War II.

Next, travel to The Stronghold of Shali, a mud-brick fortification built in the 13th century that once housed the Siwa people. Due to their construction from salt, mud, rock, and plaster, even though some of the historic town's structures are still in use, they deteriorate much more quickly each year.

The Oracle Temple also called the Aghurmi or <u>Amun Ra Temple</u>, will be our next destination. Alexander the Great made his first expedition into Egypt and then went to the Greek-built temple. (Temple of Amun Ra).

We'll go to Fatnas Lake someday. Bicycles and on foot are two ways to get to Birket Siwa's tiny island of Fatnas. In the west, Gebel Bayda and Hamra provide a lovely backdrop, making it a great place to unwind and watch the sun set across the lake. While strolling through the garden, you may see, among other sorts of trees, banana, date, and olive trees. Following that, you will be taken to your lodging.

Day 4:drive back to Cairo

Before going for Cairo, you're allowed to use Siwa more. It's also a good idea to try some of Siwa's famed dates, olives, jellies, and syrups. Herbs that are therapeutic and stress-relieving, teas, well-known lamps, and items made entirely of salt from the Siwa salt lakes are also on the list.
