day 1 : Luxor east and west banks tour

In the morning, our representative will pick you up from your hotel in Marsa Alam by A/C car to Luxor. As soon as you arrive in Luxor, you will find our tour guide waiting for you then he will escort you to enjoy your trips to Luxor and Abu Simbel starting with a visit to the famous west bank sites including

Valley of The Kings

Valley of the kings holds many temples which are carved tombs in the rocks of the mountain which became a principal burial place for the kings and it contains more than 60 tombs.

Then, head with your tour guide to visit:

Hatshepsut Temple

The Temple of Queen Hatshepsut includes a number of temples and tombs that belongs to the Pharaohs and consists of three ascending stands. Hatshepsut was a ruler and her people loved her deeply but she was also always surrounded by controversy.

Afterward, you will be transferred to end your tour to Luxor on the west bank by visiting:

Colossi of Memnon

The Colossi of Memnon are the only two remaining witnesses of the funerary temple built by Amenhotep the Third. The names of many historians and rulers were written on these statues.

After finishing your tour to Colossi of Memnon, you will enjoy your fabulous Lunch that will be served at a Nile view restaurant, your safety is our responsibility to complete your 2-day trips from Marsa Alam to Luxor & Abu Simbel.

After that, your tour guide will transfer you to the east bank to end your first day by paying a visit to the:

Temple of Karnak

Karnak temple is one of the largest ancient religious sites, which is a clear example of the joint achievement of many generations of Egyptian builders. The temple consists of three adjacent temples: the main temple, a small temple, and an external one.

In the evening our representative will transfer you by a private air-conditioned vehicle to Aswan for an overnight stay at the 5* hotel. Relax and spend your night on your way.

day 2 : Abu Simbel Tour

In the morning, continue your 2 days trips from Marsa Alam to Luxor & Abu Simbel where you will have your tasty breakfast at your hotel in Aswan, then your tour guide will pick you up from your hotel to end your tour by paying a visit to:

The Two Temples of Abu Simbel

Abu Simbel temple is an archaeological site containing two temples, the Little Temple, and the Great Temple, that were both sculpted in rocks. The temples were built during the reign of Ramesses II in 1279-1213 BC.

The reason for the construction of the temples was to celebrate the victory of "King Ramses II" in the Battle of Kadesh, The Great temple was built for the god Ptah, and Pharaoh Ramses II. The small temple was built for the goddess Hathor and Nefertiti, the wife of Ramesses II.

After that, enjoy your Lunch in Aswan, then our representative will transfer you to catch your 1st class train to Luxor, then he will transfer you to your Hotel in Marsa Alam.
