Your tour guide will be waiting for you when you cross the border into Palestine from the other side of Taba after being picked up from your hotel and transported there by bus with the rest of the party.

Travel to the Dead Sea to experience the depths of the planet. While traveling to the holy city, we will stop at

the Ourman site, the location of the Dead Sea scrolls, and observe some Bedouin tribes that live in the desert.

next stop on the tour is, of course, the Western Wall. This is the most sacred site in Jerusalem and is a must-see for anyone visiting Jerusalem. The Western Wall is a remnant of the Second Temple, which was destroyed by the Romans in 70 AD. Today, it's a place of prayer and reflection for Jews from all over the world.
