The <u>Luxor Temple</u> is an impressive complex of ancient Egyptian temples that is located on the east bank of the Nile in Luxor. Amenhotep III commissioned its construction in order to affirm the attribution of the god Amun himself, as his eligibility for the throne was uncertain according to Egyptian traditions. Additionally, the temple would serve as a central location for the worship of the three members of the Theban Triad.
