Itinerary

Day 1- Arrival to Cairo

Upon your arrival at <u>Cairo International Airport</u>, we will take care of all the necessary procedures and luggage identification. You will then be driven in a private car from the airport to your hotel for check-in.

Once you've checked in, take some time to rest. In the evening, we'll pick you up from the hotel and take you on a dinner cruise on the Nile. You'll enjoy the beautiful Nile scenery and the talented folkloric band while dining on a delicious dinner.

Day 2: Discover the Magical Pyramids

After breakfast, you will be transferred by your tour guide to see some of Cairo's main tourist attractions, such as <u>the Giza Pyramids</u> Complex. This complex was built during the 4th dynasty 2400 years ago and includes the impressive Giza Pyramids, the Valley Temple, a massive sphinx, three bigger pyramids, and six smaller pyramids.

The Great Pyramid's owner was known as "King Khufu." It is the oldest and largest of the three pyramids on the Giza plateau. The enormous, 147-meter-tall pyramid took 20 years and 2,300,000 stones to build.

We'll move on to <u>the Great Sphinx</u>, which measures 73 meters in length, 19 meters in width, and 20 meters in height. It belonged to "King Chephren" and is the biggest statue on Earth. It is the earliest significant sculpture ever made.

If you're interested in ancient Egyptian mummification, you should visit <u>the Valley Temple</u>. It's the only remaining granite temple of its kind, and it's located on the Giza plateau.

Enjoy your lunch at a restaurant with a view of the Pyramids or the Nile.

After touring Saqqara's Step Pyramid, which is from the reign of Egyptian King Djoser in the 27th century BC, it is fascinating to think about how this structure was built using cut stone. Six steps are stacked on top of one another to create a 62-meter-tall pyramid.

Next on our list is the City of Memphis. It is considered to be the first Egyptian capital and was a significant center between Upper and Lower Egypt. Memphis was said to be protected by the god Ptah, which is why it was such an important city.

Then we will take you back to your hotel for the night.

Day 3 : cairo day tours

Your tour guide will pick you up at your accommodation and take you to see:

our first stop is egyptian Museum,

The Egyptian Museum houses a magnificent collection of artwork spanning the previous 5000 years.

There are about 250,000 real artefacts on display in addition to a display of Tutankhamen's wealth, go

Id, and jewellery collection, all of which were preserved in his tomb for more than 3,500 years.

Lunch will be provided in a nearby Cairo restaurant before to the trip.

then we will visit the Citadel of Salah El Din

wh, which was enormous in scale, served as Egypt's administrative centre until the 1860s. It was built during Salah Al-rule. Din's The building's construction began in 1176 and was finished in 1182.

after that visit Mosque of Mohamed Ali

The mosque, known as "The Alabaster Mosque," was built between 1820 and 1838, and the majority of its walls were made of pure alabaster. The Muhammad Ali Mosque is a copy of the Blue Mosque in Istanbul.

then go to Khan El Khalili Market

Every journey to Cairo must include a stop at Khan El-Khalili, the oldest and most well-known market in the Middle East. It was built around 970 AD, the same year Cairo was founded.

We'll take you back to your hotel in Cairo at the end of the day so you may spend the night there.

Day 4: Cairo to Luxor / East Bank of Luxor Tour

After breakfast, check out of your accommodation and drive to the Cairo airport to take a flight to Lux or.

After meeting your Egyptologist tour guide there, you can continue your Egypt easter vacation by seeing the city's well-known sights, beginning with:

First, visit Temple of Karnak

The Karnak temple is the place in Egypt that has the most beautiful scenery. It is the world's largest t emple complex. It is the product of several Pharaohs and prehistoric builders.

The Temple of Karnak is made up of three main buildings that span over 247 acres of land.

You should transfer to your Nile cruise for lunch and some rest before going with your tour guide to se e the Luxor Temple at night.

Second, visit The Luxor Temple

The Temple of Luxor served as the focal point of the Opet Festival, which was the most significant festival. The temple, which was primarily built by Amenhotep III and King Rameses II, served as the site of festival rituals. The celebration's goal was to balance the ruler's divine and terrestrial selves.

Return to your Luxor Nile cruise for the evening.

Day 5: West Bank of Luxor/ Edfu

Your Egypt easter vacation will come to an end with a tour of the important attractions on Luxor's

west bank after breakfast on nileCruise, including:

the first stop, The valley of Kings

There are several tombs there, including those of renowned pharaoh Ramses II and young pharaoh Tutankhamen. This location serves as the ultimate resting place for Egyptian kings from the 18th to the 20th dynasties. The tombs included an abundance of every material item a king may desire in the afterlife. Almost all of the funerary ornamentation has survived.

then visit the Temple of Hatshepsut

This temple is one of the most beautiful and well-preserved from Ancient Egypt. Hatshepsut's temple had three levels, and in the centre there were two wide ramps that joined them.

after that we will visit the colossi of Memnon

Two gigantic stone statues of King Amenhotep III are the only elements of a full burial temple that are still standing. Quartzite sandstone fragments were found close to Cairo and transported 700 kilometres to Luxor to be used in the sculptures.

Spend the night on your Nile cruise after taking a break for lunch.

Day6 : Visit Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

Before leaving for: <u>The Kom Ombo Temple</u>, you will have breakfast on board the ship. The Kom Ombo Temple is a temple with a view of the Nile. This temple contains two distinct temples, each with its own hypostyle halls, sanctuaries, and entrances.

Continue your journey to the Edfu Temple, which is home to the Egyptian god Horus. The bestpreserved Greco-Roman building in Egypt is the Edfu Temple, which has a "Play" depicting Horus vanquishing Seth on its walls.

Sail to Aswan after noon, then spend the night at sea.

Day7 - Aswan Nile Cruise Tours

Embark on your Egypt Nile cruise for a delicious breakfast buffet, and then get ready to meet your per sonal tour guide to begin your Aswan Excursions as follows:

a High Dam

Visit the High Dam, which protected Egypt from the Nile floods that formerly drowned the country for months due to water waste.

Egypt's southernmost city is Aswan.

Nearly 1,000 kilometres from Cairo, it is situated in the first Nile falls.

The incomplete obelisk

When creating the vast pyramids of Egypt during the old kingdom of Egypt's history, as well as the lar ge temples, enormous pillars, and obelisks, notably during the new kingdom, ancient Egyptians used t

o cut and transport granite from the granite quarries.

Temple of Philae:

Continue your Aswan sightseeing to the Philae Temple, one of the four locations where the myth of Isis, Osiris, and Horus occurred. It was constructed and dedicated to the worship of the goddess Isis.

A quality dinner will be made and served on board the cruise boat in the evening. You will witness an engaging Nubian show and spend the night in Aswan after being transferred back to the ship and enjoying your lunch.

Day 8: Disembarkation/ Fly Back to Cairo

After breakfast in the morning, we'll check out but not before we visit <u>the temples of Abu Simbel</u> Due to their unusual architecture, the two Temples of Abu Simbel are regarded as the best buildings from ancient Egypt. Around 1200 B.C., King Ramses II constructed the temples, which are rock-cut structures. In the first temple, King Ramses II is honoured, and in the second, his loving wife Queen Nefertari is honoured. Both temples have exquisite sculptures and artwork throughout. Due to its meticulously hand-carved pillars, statues, sculptures, and wall paintings, this temple is a must-see.

After breakfast, you head to the Aswan airport to take a flight to Cairo. Transfer from Cairo airport to your place of lodging. (just to eat breakfast)

Day9 : fayoum day tour

After breakfast in the morning, we'll check out but not before we visit

To begin your tour, arrange a morning pick-up from your accommodation in Cairo. You will travel to the Fayoum Oasis with your personal guide in a comfortable, air-conditioned car. Explore the dry lagoons and ruins of the Fayoum Oasis's temples. Enjoy the waterfalls in <u>Wadi Al Rayan</u>.

At your hotel in Cairo, board a private van. Travel 105 kilometres southwest of Cairo in comfort to reach Fayoum. Arrive at the dry oasis of Fayoum Oasis, then visit <u>Quaroun Lake</u> to observe the birds. Discover more about the historic city of Karanis by perusing the Fayoum Museum's collection of sculptures and Roman portraits.

Take a break for lunch after your tour. Visit the Quaroun Lake and springs- and the wildlife-rich Wadi Al Rayan natural region. Take some photos of the largest waterfall in Egypt. Take a sail on a traditional wooden sailboat called a felucca. Finish your journey as your driver takes you back to your Cairo hotel.

Day 10: Fly to Sharm El Sheikh

After breakfast each morning, you will be driven from the hotel to <u>Cairo International Airport</u> to catch a flight to Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt's magnificent beachfront resort city. Our representatives will meet you at Sharm El Sheikh's airport and assist you with hotel check-in so you may unwind the rest of the day and take advantage of the sea, sun, and evening entertainment. The hotel's main restaurant will provide lunch and dinner buffet fare.

Day11 : Quad Bike trip

Your tour guide will pick you up from your hotel at 2:00 pm and take you in a car to the nearby Quad Bike Centre, which is about 15 minutes away. Start the Quad Bike journey after receiving a quick driving and safety orientation. Enjoy the breathtaking views as you travel over the Sinai desert's dunes. After around an hour's journey, halt at Wadi Al-highest Aat's point to rest and sip some traditional Bedouin herbal tea. After riding your bike back to Sharm, you'll be taken back to your accommodation. Free evening and overnight stay at the hotel.

Day 12: Full day Snorkeling trip to Ras Mohamed National Park by boat

Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel after breakfast, take you to the sea dock, and help you board the boat. Visit Alexandria's finest sights, such as the <u>Library of Alexandria</u>, the Catacombs of el Shaqafa, and the <u>Pompey Pillar</u>, on a day trip by driving there. Lunch will be served at a neighboring eatery.

Back to the hotel in Cairo, spend the night.

Day 15: Fly Home.
