Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival to Cairo

<u>Cairo Airport</u>: Upon arrival, a representative from our company will meet you and drive you in an airconditioned vehicle to your hotel. Cairo overnight stay

Day 2: Pyramids - Memphis - Sakkara

After having your breakfast

<u>The Great Pyramids</u> of Cheops, Chephren, Mykerinos, and <u>Sphinx</u> should be one of your first stops on your trip. A camel ride is included in the trip. Enter the Solar boat and third pyramid, which are also nearby.

The Step Pyramids of Zoser are the oldest significant stone construction in the world. They were built by King Djoser during the third dynasty (about 2630 BC).

After the people had moved to <u>Memphis</u>, which was established by King Menes and served as the first capital of Egypt for more than three thousand years, during the Old Kingdom, you will stop in Dahshur to see the Red Pyramid and the Bent Pyramid. Once you have arrived in Cairo,

you will overnight there.

Day 3: Azhar and Islamic Sites Tour.

After breakfast, you will be picked up by our guide at the hotel. Make your way to El Azhar, the earliest Islamic university, to have a visit. Continue on to Al Mouayyed Mosque, Bab Zuweila, which was constructed under Badr Al Dein Al Gamal's direction. After passing the Al Hussein Mosque, turn left onto Beit El Sehimy, a distinctive Islamic home. Continue on foot to Bab al Fetouh and Bab Al Nasr, which were constructed under the direction of Gawhar El Sakaly. Then, visit the Khan el-Khalili market. Return to your accommodation overnight.

Day 4: Islamic & Coptic Cairo Tour, Dinner Cruise

After having breakfast, begin your tour by going to the magnificent Salah El Din Citadel, where the Mohamed Ali Alabaster Mosque is located. Next, go to the Ibn Tulun Mosque, the Gair Anderson Museum, and Old Cairo, where you can see the Roman fortress, the Hanging Church (also known as the Al Moaallaka Church), and St. Sergius, who provided protection for the holy family. Make sure to take a Nile cruise in the evening with food and traditional Egyptian entertainment. Finally, you will return to your hotel in Cairo overnight.

Day 5: Luxor ,Embarkation – Light Show at Karnak

Breakfast. to catch a flight to Luxor after the transfer. Arrival, followed by transport to the cruise. Embarkation. On board lunch.

Day 6: Luxor East Bank tour

a meal served on board. Visit to the Luxor Temple to witness Ramses the Great's granite sculptures and the courtyard. Go to Karnak, which has a number of temples that were constructed during various eras. Visit the Unfinished Propylon, the Hypostyle Hall with its 134 enormous columns, the Obelisks of Queen Hatshepsut and Tutomosis III, the Temple of Amon with its papyrus and lotus decorations, the Granite Scarbeus of Amenophis III, and the Sacred Lake starting via the Avenue of Sphinxes. Go to the Luxor Museum. returning to the cruise Navigate to Esna. Dinner and Lunch on Board. Stay the night in Esna.

Day 7: Esna - Edfu.

a meal served on board. Visit the Esna Temple. Visit the Temple of Horus at Edfu after sailing there. Lunch served aboard. Reach Kom Ombo via sea. Evening tea. Disco Night. Sleep in Kom Ombo.

Day 8: Kom Ombo

Breakfast. Sail to Kom Ombo. Visit The Temple of Kom Ombo. Lunch on board. Sail to Edfu. Afternoon Tea. Dinner on board. Overnight in Aswan.

Day 9: Aswan Tour

a meal served on board. Navigate to Aswan. Visit The High Dam, which was finished in 1964, to begin your trip. You can look over Lake Nasser from here. The Agilkian island is reached by speedboat from the Philae temple. Visit the temple that was relocated from their native island of Philae and that Lake Nasser's waters

keep underwater for the most of the year. Between the 26th dynasty and the Roman era, the great Temple of Isis and associated monuments were constructed. Aswan, spend the night.

Day 10: Abu Simbel Tour

a meal served on board. A/C vehicle departure for the Temples of Abu Simbel excursion. One of the wonders of ancient Egyptian architecture is the enormous Temple of Abu Simbel, which Ramses II (of the XIXth Dynasty) erected and recently saved from being submerged by the Nile rivers. The temples were cut out of a sandstone rock cliff and have enormous facades with carvings of the gods to which each was devoted.

Lunch on board. Afternoon Tea. Dinner on board. Games Party. Overnight in Aswan.

Day 11: Hot-air Balloon Ride - Luxor West Bank Tour

a meal served on board.

Depending on the weather, the flight lasts for roughly 30:45 minutes.

Day 12: Dandara and Abydos, Cairo

a meal served on board. Disembarkation. You will be picked up from the Luxor cruise to visit the ancient sites by our guide. Visit Abydos first, where the ancient Egyptians thought the deity (Lord of the underworld) was buried. The temple, often referred to as the Seti I temple, was begun by King Seti I and finished by King Ramses II.

It is situated in Abydos City, which is 135 kilometers from Luxor and 420 kilometers south of Cairo in the Sohag Government.

One of Egypt's most exquisitely preserved art forms is found on the walls of the Osiris Temple at Abydos, where there are murals depicting the Gods and Pharaohs. Continue on to Dandara to see the temple dedicated to the goddess of joy and love, Hathor. Cairo, The temple may be found at Dandara, which is north of Luxor.

Day 13: Shopping Tour & Sound and Light show at Giza

Day 14: Alexandria Tour

Breakfast. You will be picked up by our driver at the hotel. Begin your tour of Alexandria by moving. Drive an air-conditioned car to Alexandria. Arrive, meet your tour guide, and begin the trip by going into the Catacombs, the biggest Roman cemetery, which is comprised of three levels carved out of the rock. Then you will travel to Pompay's Pillar, which was built at the end of the 4th century in honour of the Emperor Diocletian.

Visit the lighthouse, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, which is currently located on the same location as the fortress of Qaitbey.

Then go to Abbo Elabbas Mosque, the Alexandrian military unknown's largest and most beautiful mosque. Returning to the hotel Stay the night in Alexandria

Day 15: Free Day in Alexandria

Breakfast. You will be picked up by our guide at the hotel. Start your journey at the Roman Amphitheater in Alexandria, which has an exhibit of the city's submerged monuments that were found beneath its East Harbor.

Visit the Alexandria Library, which has 8 million books and is now the largest library in the world. During the visit, you may check out the reading room.

Visit the Ruler Farouk's Royal Gardens to see the royal palaces of Haramlek and Salamlek and the royal beaches of the queens. King Farouk is the last king of Egypt in recorded history. Visit St. Mark's Church, which is the oldest church in Africa.

Drive along the Cornish 30 km to see the entire city of Alexandria from the sea, including the old harbor where we discovered 7000 monuments underwater, stop over the famous Stanley modern landmark of Alexandria, visit the old down town, and stroll through the old city center to observe the real cold city of Alexandria that Alexander the Great built. Return to your hotel in style. Alexandria, for the night.

Day 16: Rosetta Tour
