Itinerary

Day 1: Welcome to Cairo!

Your guide is waiting for you at Cairo's airport when you arrive. He will help you with customs and set you up with transportation to your accommodation. You should rest so you can explore Cairo tomorrow.

Day 2: The Pyramids, Sphinx & Egyptian Museum and copitic cairo

After breakfast, take a fantastic journey to some of Egypt's most famous attractions. Start with the <u>Great Pyramids</u> of Cheops, Chephren, and Mykerinus, then move on to the <u>Sphinx</u>, the world's biggest monolithic statue and the earliest known colossal sculpture. You'll also find the <u>Valley Temple</u>, which King Chefren is said to have built in the 26th century BCE and used in part for mummification. At the <u>Egyptian Museum</u>, among other magnificent ancient Egyptian artifacts, you will see Tutankhamen's collection before leaving.

We'll start our tour of Cairo's historic downtown with the <u>Salah El-din Citadel</u>, which was once a bastion against the Crusaders. Following that, we'll walk through the ancient streets of downtown Cairo. The domed ceilings, hanging lights, and cityscape views from this historic stronghold will be sure to captivate us. Finally, we'll visit some of Old Cairo churches and the <u>Khan El Khalili</u> Old Market. This tour is sure to fascinate and impress!

Take a beautiful dinner cruise on the Nile River in the evening, enjoy an Egyptian-style supper and live entertainment, and watch a beautiful Nile sunset before returning to your accommodation for the evening.

Day 3: Fly to Luxor & Sightsee

You'll take a quick flight to Luxor after breakfast. The distance between this little city in the Nile Valley and Cairo is 420 miles (676 kilometres). Visits to the greatest remaining temple in Egypt, the <u>Karnak Temple</u>, are among the day's activities. It was a significant religious center formerly and was founded in the Middle Kingdom. You'll also see the enormous <u>Luxor Temple</u> complex, which is situated on the east bank of the Nile. Around 1400 BCE, during the New Kingdom, it was established.

Day 4: Explore the West Bank

Take a boat today and begin your trip down the Nile. You'll go to the Valley of the Monarchs to witness the rock-cut tombs for kings and wealthy nobility from the sixteenth to the eleventh centuries BCE, including Tutankhamun. Following that, you'll stop at the <u>Colossi of Memnon</u> to view the remains of Amenhotep's memorial temple. Only two towering sculptures of Pharaoh Amenhotep III, which were built to protect the temple's entrance, are still standing. the <u>Hatshepsut Temple</u> next. The centerpiece of Deir el-Bahri, a collection of funerary temples and tombs, is the monument to Queen Hatshepsut.

Day 5: Cruise to the Temple of Edfu and kom ombo

On your route to the temples at Edfu, your next stop today, you'll pass Esna Lock. The significance of these temples will be further discussed by your guide. Between 237 and 57 BCE work was done on the <u>Temple of Horus at Edfu</u>. One of Egypt's best-preserved sanctuaries, you can still pick out many of its inscriptions within. After supper, you may unwind on the boat while watching the Nile's sun set.

The river trip keeps on till it reaches Kom Ombo. The crocodile deity (Sobek) and falcon god (Haroeris) were honoured at the Temple of Sobek and Haroeris at Kom Ombo (Haroeris). Along with wall carvings and statues, many of the walls of its courts, halls, sanctuaries, and chambers are still in tact. The trip continues in the late afternoon to Aswan, where you'll spend the night.

Day 6: Aswan sightseeing

Today, there will be time to tour the 1970-completed Aswan <u>High Dam</u>, which was started in the 1960s. At the time, it was a feat of engineering since it quadrupled Egypt's electrical supply and expanded its arable land by 30%. Visit the <u>Philae Temple</u> instead, whose construction started in 690 BCE.

then we will explore the majestic <u>Abu Simbel Temples</u>, a pair of temples constructed during Ramses II's 1279–1213 BCE rule in Egypt.

Enjoy your meal and the night aboard the ship.

Day 7: Fly Back to Cairo & Relax

You'll board a flight back to Cairo this morning. Upon arrival, we will transfer you to your Cairo hotel to relax and in the evening you can do some shopping, try Egyptian cuisine, or just soak in the sunset views over the Nile River.

Day8:Cairo to Fayoum

The best site to begin your countryside journey is <u>Tunis Village</u>, which is situated across from the lovely <u>Lake Qarun</u>. Our tour guide will pick you up from your hotel in Cairo and drive you to Fayuom in a contemporary, air-conditioned vehicle. On a tour that offers a taste of Egyptian agricultural life, one may find the renowned pottery studios and schools in the hamlet as well as a few businesses that provide desert safari excursions to the area's stunning environs.

The magnificent Lake Qarun, which spans for miles along the main road near to Tunis Village, is a must-see in Fayoum. Every time you see a boat, you may be sure to hitch a ride. You can rely on the calm waves to

provide you a tranquil experience as they gently raise and lower you.

Then, at one of the few safari shops strewn around Tunis Village, request to be taken to Magic Lake.

It's just beautiful to see this magnificent lake, which is hidden by a wall of sand dunes and undergoes seasonal colour changes.

Off-roading is exhilarating, but to get there, the tour leader will jam you into a whining 44 and drive you 45 minutes across the desert.

They will prepare a lovely dinner for you as soon as you get at the lake, lay out some blankets and Bedouin tea, and then help you slide down the dune on the sandboard to the amazing natural beauty.

Take a Felucca to Wadi Al Rayan, Egypt's largest natural oasis, where you may explore and take stunning images.

We will then transfer you to the Fayoum hotel where you may unwind and spend the night.

Day9: fayoum to cairo

You will be picked up by our tour guide after breakfast to go to <u>Wadi El Hitan</u>, often known as the "Valley of the Whales," a fascinating UNESCO World Heritage site that was originally a lake and is now the home to coastal marine species that have survived for millions of years. The preserved fossilised whale remnants found here demonstrate how the mammal changed from a terrestrial to a marine species. There is no doubt that trips to this magnificent location are worthwhile, then we'll make a pit break for lunch at a nearby restaurant.

We'll then travel there. The Kom Aushim Museum is our next stop, and it's a great spot to pick up a map of the entire city of Fayoum. Construction of the Museum's first phase started in 1974. A image of Fayoum is shown beside artefacts that date from the Prehistoric through the Roman eras.

the stop that followed One of the largest Greco-Roman settlements in the Fayoum is Karanis (The Lord's Town). In the third century B.C., mercenaries from Ptolemy the Second's army first took up residence there. There are two temples in the city.

After that, we'll take you back to your hotel in Cairo.

Day 10: Depart

The journey is over today. To catch your flight out, proceed to the Cairo airport. Travel safely!
