Itinerary

Day 1 - Cairo: Arrival, egyptiam museum

Greetings from Cairo! Your trip will start when our representative welcomes you and helps you with the necessary paperwork for customs and immigration. He will then drive you to your swiss inn hotel in Cairo in our luxurious vehicle once you have gathered your luggage.

then we will visit <u>The Museum of Egyptian</u> Antiquities, known commonly as the Egyptian Museum or Museum of Cairo, in Cairo, Egypt, which is home to an extensive collection of ancient Egyptian antiquities. It has 120,000 items, with a representative amount on display, and the remainder in storerooms. Built-in 1901 by the Italian construction company Garozzo-Zaffarani to a design by the French architect Marcel Dourgnon, the edifice is one of the largest museums in the region. As of March 2019, the museum is open to the public. In 2020 the museum is due to be superseded by the new Grand Egyptian Museum at Giza.

after that, we will have lunch at a local restaurant and return you to your hotel overnight.

Day 2 - Giza pyramids and citadel

Breakfast at the hotel is followed by a full-day tour. In the morning you will be driven to see <u>The Great</u> <u>Sphinx</u> and <u>the Pyramids of Giza</u> are the most well-known structures from antiquity, not just in Egypt. Around 4,500 years ago, these enormous stone constructions were constructed on a stony desert plateau near the Nile.

In the afternoon, and after lunch visit one of the oldest <u>Egyptian citadels</u> that Salah El Din El Ayoby constructed, as well as one of Egypt's most stunning mosques, the Mohamed Ali Mosque, popularly known as the Alabaster Mosque due to its Alabaster stone construction.

At the end of this exciting day, you will be driven back to your hotel.

Day 3 -arrival siwa

At 6:00 am Our knowledgeable tour guide will pick you up from your hotel in Cairo and transport you by private air-conditioned vehicle to the <u>western part of Egypt</u>. when we arrive Siwa, we transfer you to your Ghaliet Ecolodge Siwa hotel

lunch and overnight stay at our Siwa hotel

Day 4 - siwa tour

Hotel breakfast is available. Pickup from the hotel begins at 7:00 am. Let's start with the Temple of the Oracle, popularly known as <u>the Alexander the Great Temple</u>. The Siwan oracle is thought to have been consulted by Alexander the Great in order to affirm that he was Zeus' son. The Greek creator deity,

Next, go to the salty lake. You can float in the salty water without having to be a strong swimmer. Be careful when swimming and avoid letting the water go in your eyes. Pick the clearest lake; you'll be able to tell it's the purest one when you can see the bottom. Keep a bottle of water nearby to use as a rinse after swimming because the lakes have powerful healing capabilities that are far stronger than those of ordinary seawater. You will always make for a fantastic swim!

next head to The Spring of the Sun, Cleopatra's bath. Consider taking a lunch break to enjoy some Siwan food in a Siwan restaurant. According to mythology, Cleopatra once swam here.

Go to the Great Sand Sea after that. Have an adventure in the desert by discovering it via Jeep 4x4 and enjoying <u>sandboarding</u>. Here in the Great Sand Sea next to <u>Siwa Oasis</u> are Egypt's best sand dunes for sand boarding.

After that, explore <u>Bir Waheed</u>, a hot and cold spring, and then relax with some traditional Bedouin tea before setting up a tent. Dinner and a night's stay in a hotel in Swia.

Day5 - Siwa | Masra Matrouh

after breakfast, we will transfer to Marsa Matruh by a modern and air-conditioned car, when we arrive there we check in at your hotel and have lunch and overnight

Day 6 - Marsa Matruh and el Alamein tour

after breakfast, our tour leader pick you up from your hotel to Visit Marsa Matruh, a settlement built by Alexander the Great when he traveled to the Siwa Oasis, which is situated on the city's shoreline. The remarkable Al Awam mosque, one of the city's trademarks, will be the first stop on the journey. Following that, you'll go to St. Mary's Church, which is located in the heart of the city. To find Libyan specialties, go to the Libyan bazaar. Visit the cave where the salt from the Mediterranean Sea was taken to unwind. Considering that the body is so heavily iodine-infused from the cave, it absorbs tension, bad energy, and fatigue. A stroll through the city's streets follows the tour.

then we will transfer to Alamein. We go to the WWII Museum and the War Memorial there, which are

filled with uniforms, weapons, flags, and other memorabilia from the conflict. Photographs and combat places are displayed.

Visit the El Alamein War Cemetery, where 7,367 British, Australian, New Zealand, South African, Greek, French, Indian, and Malaysian soldiers are interred in individual graves with 11,945 more whose remains have never been discovered.

Visit the Italian War Memorial and the German War Memorial as well. On the journey, a light lunch will be provided.

in the end, we will transfer you to Alexandria and check in at your Paradise Inn hotel and overnight

Day 7 - Alexandria tour

after breakfast, our tour leader will pick you up from your hotel to visit the New<u>Alexandria Library</u> (Bibliotheca Alexandrina), with shelf space for eight million books, with the main reading room on eleven levels and we will visit the <u>Roman Amphitheatre</u>, which every town in the ancient Roman Empire had then we will visit the <u>Alexandria National Museum</u>, built in a former palace and now houses almost 2000 artifacts which tell the story of the city, including the recent finds from the sunken part of the city

finally, we will visit <u>the Citadel of Qaitbay</u>, where about 1480 AD the Mameluke Sultan Al-Ashraf Qaitbay fortified the site, which held the ruins of the Alexandria Lighthouse, and with successive improvements, it now stands as a very prominent Citadel on the Mediterranean coastline.

then we will have lunch at a local restaurant after that we will visit Mahmoud Said Museum is located in Alexandria. Put Mahmoud Said Museum to see other points of interest to visit during your vacation in Alexandria.

in the end , we will transfer you to your Cairo hotel

Day 8 - Nile Cruise: Luxor (Eastbank)

You will check out after breakfast, and our representative will drive you to the airport to catch your trip to Luxor. When you arrive, a representative from our company will welcome you and aid in getting you to your cruise boat.

You will eat lunch on board before visiting the beautiful <u>Karnak</u> and <u>Luxor Temples</u>. You will return to the boat for dinner and overnight

Day 9 -Nile Cruise: Luxor (Westbank)

A new day, your first meal on board, and it's time to explore the West Bank of Luxor, which includes the magnificent temple of Queen Hatshepsut at Deir El-Bahri, the tombs of princes in the Valley of the Queens, the tombs of the New Kingdom pharaohs in the Valley of the Kings, and the enormous Colossi of Memnon. You will be returned to your boat for lunch after this excursion to the Theban "City of the Dead," where you may watch as it leaves Luxor in search of Esna. Dinner will be provided while you relax and watch the Nile flow beneath you.

Day 10 - Nile Cruise: Edfu

You can have your breakfast while watching the cruise ship pass through the Esna lock and continue sailing to <u>Edfu</u>, where the Temple of Horus is the best-preserved temple in Egypt. After supper, your guide will take you back to your cruise ship as it gracefully approaches <u>Kom Ombo</u>.

Day 11 -Nile Cruise: Kom Ombo, Aswan (High Dam, Philae)

Breakfast is served before you visit the Temple of <u>Kom Ombo</u>, which is devoted to the gods Horus and Sobek, on your final day of sailing.

Following that, it's back to the boat for lunch before setting sail for Aswan. Once on land, you will be taken to view the <u>High Dam</u>, the largest rock-filled dam in the world, and the Temple of Philae, which was relocated to the island of Agilika after being submerged by Lake Nasser. The final dinner on the boat is then back in Aswan.

Day 12 - Nile Cruise: Aswan (Botanical Garden), Flight to Marsa allam

Before you must check out, you will eat your last breakfast on the yacht. Then a felucca will transport you to the Botanical Gardens.

You will then be driven to Aswan Airport to catch your flight to Marsa Allam following this tour. When you arrive, a representative from our company will meet you and help you with your luggage before taking you to your Akasia Swiss Resort so you can check-in and overnight.

Day 13 - free day in marsa alam

Marsa Alam offers thrilling quad safaris through the desert. Your hotel will pick you up, and you'll be driven to the Sahara. Get away from the busy metropolis and be astounded by the wonders of the desert. You will eventually arrive at a Bedouin community, where you may observe the culture and way of life of the locals.
