Itinerary

Day 1- Arrival to Cairo

At <u>Cairo International Airport</u>, a representative from our company will greet you and help you. Transfer to the hotel in a private car with air conditioning, Stay the night at the hotel.

Day 2- Tour Giza Pyramids, Sphinx, Memphis, and Saqqara

begins at 8:00 a.m. Pickup by our tour guide from your Cairo hotel following breakfast The Great Pyramids of Giza (Cheops, Chephren and Mykerinos) are the first stop on your full-day tour of Giza. Next, go to the Valley Temple, where the priests mummified King Chephren's remains. You may also get a close-up view of The Sphinx, a fabled protector with a lion's body and king Chephren's head that stands near a sizable funerary complex.

Between visits, lunch is provided at a nearby restaurant based on a full meal for each person; however, beverages are not covered.

Then drive to Sakkara that is included in our <u>Egypt Classic tours</u>, which is only 27 kilometers southwest of Cairo. Visit the <u>Step Pyramid</u> (built for King Zoser), which is regarded as a crucial stage in the evolution of the pyramids from the straightforward mastaba to its well-known shape.

Next, go to the Dahshur Pyramids (Bent and Red Pyramids) About 40 kilometers (25 miles) south of Cairo, on the West Bank of the Nile, lies a royal necropolis called Dahshur region. It is well renowned for its several pyramids, two of which were constructed between 2613 and 2589 BCE, and are among the oldest, biggest, and best preserved in all of Egypt.

Visit Memphis City, the former capital of Egypt, to see the enormous statue of Ramses II and the magnificent Sphinx made of alabaster. This City has been around since 3100 B.C.

You will be transported back to your hotel following the Tour.

Day 3 - Egyptian Museum, Khan El Khalili, and Old Cairo Tour

After breakfast, our representative will pick you up from your hotel to take you on a tour of Cairo that includes a stop at the <u>Egyptian Museum</u>, which houses artifacts from the Pharaonic era. The collection, which spans 5000 years and is said to be the world's greatest and most valuable collection of Egyptian art, is on exhibit in the museum. There are almost 250,000 astounding artifacts on display.

You will then go on to lunch, which will be provided at a nearby restaurant. Continue traveling until you reach Islamic Cairo, where Khan El Khalili, Cairo's historic bazaar, is located. The Hanging Church, the Church of St. Barbara, and the Church of Abu Serga are the next stops on our journey to Coptic Cairo. Afterwards, you'll be returned to your Cairo hotel.

Day 4 - Cairo Tower & Cairo Citadel Tour

After breakfast, our representative will pick you up from your hotel to Visit The <u>Cairo Tower</u>, a free-standing concrete tower in Cairo, Egypt, to have the chance to learn more about Egypt. It is now the highest point in Cairo. It has been North Africa's and Egypt's tallest building at 187 m for almost 50 years. Up there, you can see the Great Pyramids of Giza, Saladin Citadel, the Nile, and all of Cairo; it was the highest building in Africa for 10 years up until 1971. It is a beautiful perspective and an excellent experience.

After that, you will drive up to the <u>Saladin Citadel</u>, which Salah al-Din built in 1183 AD as a defense against Crusader soldiers on the Mokattam Hills. It is now a preserved historic site with mosques and museums, including the <u>Mosque of Muhammad Ali</u> Pasha, and is well-known for its clean air and expansive views of Cairo.

then return you back to your Cairo hotel.

Day 5 - Tour to Manial Mohamed Ali Palace, Abdeen Palace and Baron Palace.

After breakfast, our tour guide will meet you in the lobby of your hotel and take you by air-conditioned car to the magnificent Manial Palace of Prince Mohamed Ali Pasha, well-known as King Farouk's uncle that is included in our <u>Classic tours in Egypt</u>. In order to create imaginative combinations in spatial design, architectural and interior decorations, and luxurious materials, he had it designed in a style that blended European Art Nouveau and Rococo with several traditional Islamic architecture styles, including Ottoman, Moorish, and Persian. The prince's collection of rare tropical plants was established in the grounds around his house compound, which is made up of five different and individually themed structures.

Then you'll go there, The ancient <u>Abdeen Palace</u> in Cairo was constructed as one of the official homes for Egypt's erstwhile governing dynasty and royal family. It is now one of the President of Egypt's official houses and is situated above Qasr el-Nil Street in eastern Downtown Cairo.

After that, you'll visit the <u>Baron Palace</u>, which was founded by Belgian businessman Baron Edward Empain and is situated on Al-Oruba Street in Heliopolis, Cairo. The palace is constructed in the style of Indian architecture.

The construction of the palace got underway shortly after the Suez Canal opened in the nineteenth century when Belgian millionaire Baron Edward Empain planned to build an ancient castle in Egypt that was influenced by Indian architecture since he loved to travel.

You will be taken back to the hotel when the trip is over.

Day 6 - Aswan sightseeings

After being picked up from your hotel in Cairo to catch a flight for Aswan, you will be transferred to a Nile cruise for lunch before visiting <u>Aswan</u>, where you will see the <u>Temple of Philae</u> and take a Felucca trip to see <u>Elephantine</u>, the High Dam, and the <u>Unfinished Obelisk</u>.

Phiala Temple: The final temple constructed in the traditional Egyptian architecture, it was constructed to worship the goddess Isis. It was one of the final outposts where the goddess was worshiped, with construction starting around 690 BC.

The High Dam: The Aswan High Dam is an earthen dam that separates Egypt from Sudan in the north. The River Nile feeds the dam, and the reservoir creates <u>Lake Nasser</u>. The project's construction started in 1960 and was finished in 1968. It was formally opened in 1971.

The Unfinished Obelisk: The best granite used to create sculptures and adorn temples, pyramids, and obelisks in ancient Egypt came from Aswan. Although the overall building process is still unclear, the massive unfinished obelisk in the Northern Quarries has revealed significant light on how these monuments were made. With the exception of the inscriptions, three of the shaft's roughly 42m-long sides were finished.

12 p.m. Lunch on the Cruise

Take advantage of Felucca's sailing tour around Elephantine island.

Check out a Nubian Village, The Nubian Village is vibrant, enjoyable, and welcoming. Dinner & overnight onboard the Cruise.

Day 7 - visit Kom Ombo and sail to Edfu.

After Breakfast on board the Nile cruise, we'll visit the Kom Ombo Temple in the early morning.

The temple was built in honor of the gods Sobek and Horus and dates mostly to the Ptolemaic and Roman periods (332 B.C. – 395 A.C.) After that, we will return to the Nile Cruise and sail to Edfu, where we will spend the night. Dinner & overnight onboard the Cruise.

Day 8- Edfu and Luxor temple

Having breakfast while on a Nile cruise and visiting <u>EdfuTemple</u> which is upper Egyptian site with a sizable temple to the hawk-god Horus, that has been well preserved The construction of the Ptolemaic temple of Horus, which was built on the foundation of an even older temple, took place between the reigns of Ptolemy the Third (246 B.C.). The myth of Horus and Seth's conflict is described on the walls and is likely played every year as a religious drama.

Pass the Esna lock as you sail to Luxor.

then visit the <u>Luxor Temple</u>, which was mostly constructed by the New Kingdom pharaoh Amenhotep III and completed by King Tutankhamon and the Great King Ramses II. Ramses II also raised the first pylon,

which was decorated with his military victory at the Battle of Kadesh.

Dinner and a night spent on board.

Day 9 -Luxor sightseeings

During the Nile trip, have breakfast on board and see Luxor's west bank and Karnak.

The <u>Valley of the Kings</u> is a majestic realm of the Pharaohs who once lay in enormous stone sarcophagi, awaiting eternity. Originally known as the Great Place of the Truth, this valley is now known as the Valley of the Kings. The Pyramid-Shaped Mountain Peak dominates the remote valley behind Deir el Bahri.

The Memnon Colossi: Huge pair of sculptures They are the remnants of what was once the biggest structure on the west bank, built by Amenhotep the Third, and are known as the <u>Colossi of Memnon</u>. They rise roughly 18 M above the plain.

The <u>Temple of Hatshepsut</u>: The temple of Hatshepsut merges with the sheer limestone cliffs of the eastern face of the Theban Mountain. As if Nature herself had constructed this extraordinary monument, rising out of the desert plain in a series of terraces.

Night before embarking on the cruise in Luxor.

Day 10 - Disembark- fly to Cairo

Disembark from your Nile cruise after taking your last open buffet breakfast aboard the cruise ship our <u>Egypt trips</u>, then we will transfer you to luxor airport to catch your flight to cairo, upon arrival cairo, check in your hotel, relax and overnight.

Day 11- Desert and Bahariya Oasis Day Trip

The excursion starts at 6:00 AM with pickup from your hotel in Cairo and departs the city through the nearby desert sceneries. The beautiful <u>Bahariya Oasis</u>, which once served as the Pharaonic era's primary agricultural hub, is the day's first visit.

It has become renowned for its abundant supply of dates and olives. With the assistance of your guide, tour the oasis and take in the expansive setting of shady palm trees and natural springs.

Visit the <u>Black Desert</u> after lunch for a spectacular view of the region's rough mountain-like domes that stand out against the sandy surroundings. Next, explore the lovely <u>Agabat valley</u> in the neighborhood, which features imposing white cliff walls and yellow limestone rocks.

Continue on to the Crystal Mountain, an exceptionally rare structure that sparkles and shimmers in the Egyptian sun and is formed completely of calcite crystal.

Next, proceed to the White Desert, so named because of the vast expanse of white sand that it contains. Climb a few sand dunes and take in the mind-blowing views that never seem to end.

Finally, relax on the journey back to Cairo and arrive at your hotel overnight.

Day 12 - Departure

On the last day of your <u>Egypt travel packages</u> enjoy your breakfast then you are going to be transferred to cairo airport to take your flight back to your home.
