Day 1: arrival day.

Our expert Egypt tours tour leader will pick you up from Cairo international airport and then take you to your hotel in Cairo by private AC vehicle to arrange for the next day's journey.

Day meals: Welcome drink lunch.

Day 2: pyramids tour

on the second day in the early morning enjoy your breakfast and the transfer to.

Giza pyramids:

The pyramid entered the list of the seven wonders of the world, and this is because of its high rise and great construction; The height of each side of the pyramid is 231 meters, and the weight of each brick in the pyramid is 2.5 tons, while the weight of the entire pyramid is 6 million tons. The pyramids are located in the Egyptian area of Giza, that is, in the western region of the Nile River.

Memphis:

This is the ancient city founded by King Mina _ in Memphis. It is worth mentioning that it was the capital of Egypt in the era of the Old Kingdom and the center of governance and culture for more than 3000 years. Accordingly, in Memphis, you can see the amazing statue of Ramses II and the alabaster Sphinx.

Saqqara:

In this interesting place, you can enjoy visiting the step pyramid of King Djoser. It is the oldest major stone structure in the world dating back to the Third Dynasty.

Day 3: Cairo attraction tour

on the third day of the 13 Days Cairo, Nile cruise, Fayoum, and Baharyia oasis package. take your breakfast and start the visits.

Egyptian museum:

The Egyptian Museum is the oldest archaeological museum in the Middle East and houses the largest collection of ancient Egyptian antiquities in the world. The museum displays a large collection spanning from the pre-dynastic period to the Greek and Roman periods.

Saladin Citadel:

Salah al-Din Castle is located in the "Citadel" neighborhood that follows the Caliph's Department. It was built on one of the hills separated from Mount Mokattam on the outskirts of Cairo. The Castle of Salah al-Din, or what is known as the Castle of the Mountain, is one of the most important landmarks of Islamic Cairo, which does not resemble any fortress. Traditional, which made it one of the most important tourist attractions in Cairo.

Khan El Khalili Bazar:

If we go back in time a lot, we will see the most famous Arab historian (Al-Maqrizi), who says that the khan is a large square building that surrounds a courtyard and resembles an agency, the lower layer of which includes shops, and the upper layers include stores and housing. He was the chief merchant in the era of Sultan Barquq in 1400 AD.

Day 4: east bank of luxor

wake up early in the morning have your tasty breakfast then transfer to the airport and fly to Luxor, do your check-in on the Nile cruise, and visit.

Karnak temple:

The Karnak Temple is distinguished by the fact that it includes a group of diverse and numerous temples that were built starting from the 11th Dynasty around the year 2134 BC. All temples inside Karnak are surrounded by brick walls, linked to each other by corridors guarded by statues stacked on two rows of the Sphinx, known as the way of rams.

Luxor temple:

Luxor Temple A large complex of ancient Egyptian temples located on the east bank of the Nile in the city of Luxor today known as (Old Thebes). Founded in 1400 BC. Luxor Temple was built to worship Amun-Re and his wife Mut and their son Khonsu; They are the gods who are also called the Theban Trinity (The Thebes Trinity).

Valley of kings:

The Valley of the Kings was known in the past as "the great royal funeral city for millions of years of the life, strength, and health of the pharaoh in the west of Thebes."

Hatshepsut temple:

At the same time, the Temple of Hatshepsut is distinguished by the fact that we find on its walls inscriptions of naval missions sent by Queen Hatshepsut to the country of Punt for trade and to bring incense and myrrh from that country. The pharaohs used to offer incense to their gods to gain their approval, and many of the pharaohs of Egypt recorded this in paintings on their temples showing them offering offerings and incense to various deities.

Colossi of Memnon:

The statue of Memnon belongs to King Amenhotep III, as it was supervised by the famous architect Amenhotep Ibn Habu, and in the past, there was an ancient funerary temple of King Amenhotep III, and nothing remains of it except the two statues, each of which is about 21.90 meters high, and they are considered part of the agenda Tourist attractions for foreigners.

Day 6: Edfu and Kom Ombo

Edfu temple:

The city of Edfu in the ancient Egyptian Pharaonic language was called Edbo or Debo, which means the town of intrusion. Edfu, according to its current name, is close to the Coptic name, Etbu. The Ptolemies called it Apollopolis Magna, which means the great city of Apollo.

Kom Ombo temple:

This temple was built during the reign of Ptolemy VI Philometor, but its decoration was not completed until the Roman era, during the time of Emperor Tiberius. Local worship in the place.

Day 7: Aswan day tour

High Dam:

The High Dam protected Egypt from disasters of drought and famine as a result of successive floods

of scarce revenues from 1979 to 1987 when nearly 70 billion cubic meters were withdrawn from the reservoir in the High Dam Lake to compensate for the annual deficit in the natural revenue of the Nile River.

Unfinished Obelisk:

Pink granite obelisk in Aswan, Egypt. It is located in the northern part of a quarry there, located near Aswan on the eastern shore of the Nile and about 1 km east of the Nile River.

Philae temple:

The name "Phil" is due to the Greek word "Philai", which means "beloved", and it was known in Arabic literature as "Anas al-Wujud", in reference to the legend of Anas al-Wujud in the folklore stories "One Thousand and One Nights". As for the ancient Egyptian and Coptic name, it is "Bilak", which means the end or the end because it was the last frontier of Egypt in the south.

Abu Simbel:

The Abu Simbel Temple in Aswan Governorate is one of the most famous archaeological temples in Egypt. The importance of the Great Abu Simbel Temple is due to its association with the phenomenon of the sun perpendicular to the face of the statue of Pharaoh Ramses II twice a year, the first corresponding to October 22 and the second on February 22 of each year.

It is believed that 40 million years ago, Wadi El-Rayan was located under a very huge ocean, and due to geological changes, this ocean receded back and left behind a large number of marine animals, including whales, which were observed to a large degree, and where hundreds of fossilized skeletons of some types of primary whales were discovered, as well as many Shells, sharks, etc.

Lake Qaroun:

That closed fresh lake in the heart of the Western Desert, connected to the Nile River with a lifeline called "Bahr Yusuf", which is one of the ancient water channels established by King Amenemhat II in the 19th century BC, to supply Lake Qarun with the flood waters, stems from the city of Dayrit in Assiut Governorate, then It passes through the governorates of Minya and Beni Suef until it reaches the lake

Wadi El Rayan:

Wadi El Rayan Reserve is characterized by its integrated desert environment, including sand dunes, natural springs, various plant life, diverse wild animals, and important and diverse marine fossils.

Day 12: Baharyia Oasis

Have your breakfast in the early morning, and travel to Baharyia Oasis to visit.

the white desert.

It is located 45 kilometers north of Farafra Oasis in the New Valley Governorate, southwest of Cairo, with this name because the white color covers most of its parts.

The total area of the White Desert is 3,010 square kilometers, and it was declared a nature reserve in 2002.

This reserve is considered an "open museum for studying desert environments, geographical phenomena, fossils and wildlife, and containing antiquities dating back to the prehistoric era," according to the website of the Ministry of State for Environmental Affairs.

the black desert:

At the edge of the Black Desert, there are black volcanic hills that erupted ages ago and brought out a volcanic substance called Jasper, the substance of which the Black Desert is made. The English mountain is the highest peak in the Black Desert.
