Itinerary

Day 1: The begining of the trip in Aswan

On the first day of your: 4 Days 3 Nights Nile cruise from Aswan to Luxor, MS Hapi 5. you will be taken from the meeting spot with Cairo Top Tours tour guide the trip in Aswan Attractions which you will spend it on a board called MS Hapi 5 as it is going to be your first and the major transportation and hotel, start with:

<u>High Dam</u>: the huge high dam was built in Gamal and el Nasser era under his orders and it is used now to generate electricity, and store water band protects Egypt from floods.

<u>unfinished obelisk</u>: this obelisk when the ancient Egyptians were about to extract it cracks in the floor happened so they stopped the work.

Philae temple: it was built to honor the god of Isis, Discover the story and the facts of this complex temple.

Then have your lunch on the MS Hapi board. and then your dinner before you sleep on your first overnight at the lands of the oldest civilization.

Day 2: tour in Kom Ombo

Have your breakfast on board MS Hapi then start enjoying the sightseeing on the way to the Kom Ombo, once when you get to the right site start the tour in :

<u>Kom Ombo temple:</u> In ancient Egypt, this city was important because it controlled the routes of the commercial caravans that went to Nubia through the valley of the Nile.

then sail all the way to Edfu, make it you are stopped on the second day of your 4 Days 3 Nights Nile cruise from Aswan to Luxor, MS Hapi 5 tour and have your overnight and set yourself for the next day's journey.

Day 3 : Edfu temple.

then have your Egyptian ingredients lunch on the deck of the board. and before you sleep there is a sound and light show optional tour at the Karnak temple.

Day 4: last day / sail to luxor

On the last day of the adventure you will be taken to Luxor to see the east and the west banks of the city starting from the west bank of Luxor:

<u>valley of the kings</u>: the place where the ancient Egyptian kings were buried to be protected from the robbers who robbed the tombs of the kings before.

<u>colossi of Memnon</u>: these two huge statues that got rebuilt multiple times are for, king Amenhotep |||, his wife tye, and the mother Metumwya.

then for the east bank of Luxor:

visit <u>Karnak temple</u>: The original temple was destroyed and partially restored by <u>Hatshepsut</u>, although another pharaoh built it around it in order to change the focus or orientation of the sacred area. Many portions

of it may have been carried away for use in other buildings.

<u>luxor temple</u>: The Luxor Temple was constructed of sandstone blocks from Nubia. The temple is surrounded by mud-brick walls which symbolize the separation between the world and the sacred realm of the gods.
