Day 1: (arrival day)

On the first day of the MS Moon dance ship Nile cruise tour from Aswan to Luxor you will be picked-up from your place then fly all the way to Aswan and do your check in on the Nile cruise, after you are done from your day visits.

[High Dam:](#)

the huge high dam was built in Gamal and el Nasser era under his orders and it is used now to generate electricity, and store water and protects Egypt from floods.

[unfinished obelisk:](#)

this obelisk when the ancient Egyptians were about to extract it cracks in the floor happened so they stopped the work.

[Philae temple:](#)

it was built to honor the god of Isis, Discover the story and the facts of this complex temple.

Then have your lunch on the MS Moon dance ship board. and then your dinner before you sleep on your first overnight at the lands of the oldest civilization.

Day 2: tour in Kom Ombo

Have your breakfast on board MS Moon dance ship Nile cruise tour from Aswan to Luxor then start enjoying the sightseeing on the way to the Kom Ombo, once when you get to the right site start the tour in :

[Kom Ombo temple:](#)

This temple was built between the year 180 to the year 47 BC, and is considered one of the most important tourist destinations in Aswan.

then sail all the way to Edfu, where you will be stop to the next day of your 4 Days 3 Nights Nile cruise from Aswan to Luxor on MS Moon dance ship tour and have your overnight and set yourself for the next day's journey.

Day 3 : Edfu temple.

Wake up on the beautiful waters of the Nile and start your day with a tasty breakfast then on a Nile cruise from Aswan to Luxor, MS Moon dance ship. visit :

this temple that is honored the god [Horus](#), and provides important information on language, myth, and religion during the Hellenistic period in Egypt. Definition. EDFU. Erbium Doped Fiber Unit.

then have your Egyptian ingredients lunch on the board.

And before you sleep there is a sound and light show (optional tour) at [the Karnak temple](#).

Day 4 : End of service - sail to Luxor

On the last day of the adventure you will be taken to Luxor to see the east and the west banks of the city starting from the west bank of Luxor:

[valley of the kings:](#)

Most of the kings of the eighteenth, nineteenth, and twentieth dynasties of the New Kingdom (about 1550 - 1069 BC) were buried in a dry river valley on the west bank of the ancient city of Thebes (modern Luxor), hence the name Valley of the Kings.

[colossi of Memnon:](#)

Only two giant statues remain of the funerary temple, with a height of up to 20 meters. The temple was used as a quarry from which stones were cut during the era of the Nineteenth Dynasty.

then for the east bank of Luxor:

visit [Karnak temple:](#)

It was built by King Tuthmosis III in the west, and it is the smallest of all ten edifices, and it is considered a compass, as it is a northern granite column engraved on its top with a lotus flower, which was growing in the Lower Egypt, and the other and the south opposite it is engraved with the papyrus plant, which was growing in Upper Egypt.

[Luxor temple:](#)

The credit for the construction of Luxor Temple goes to both King Ramses II of the Nineteenth Dynasty and King Amenhotep III of the Eighteenth Dynasty. The outer parts of the Luxor Temple belong to King Ramses II, while the inner parts belong to King Amenhotep III, and there are some names of different kings in the Luxor Temple.

at the end of your trip, you will be taken to the first spot where will be our end of service.
