## Day 1: East Bank Tour

Begin your Egyptian adventure as our tour manager meets you at [Luxor Airport](#), the railway station, or your hotel for a comfortable transfer to the MS Nile Radamis cruise.

After a delicious buffet lunch onboard, you'll embark on a guided tour of Luxor's East Bank. Explore the awe-inspiring [Karnak Temple](#), dedicated to Amun-Ra, the sun god, and his divine family. Next, visit the majestic [Luxor Temple](#), a significant site from the New Kingdom era.

End your day with a delightful dinner aboard the cruise while enjoying a lively folkloric show. Overnight stay in Luxor.

## Day2: Touring the West Bank, including the Hatshepsut Temple and the Valley of the Kings

For a thrilling start, consider an optional hot air balloon ride over Luxor at dawn. After an early breakfast on the cruise, your guide will take you to the West Bank to visit [the Valley of the Kings](#), where you'll learn about the intricate process of tomb construction in ancient Egypt. Continue to the [Temple of Hatshepsut](#), famously known as El Deir El Bahari, and see the towering [Colossi of Memnon](#). After the tour, return to the cruise for lunch as the ship sails towards Edfu. Enjoy dinner onboard and overnight in Edfu.

## Explore the Temples of Edfu and Kom Ombo on Day 3

Start your day with a fresh breakfast before visiting the [Edfu](#) Temple, dedicated to Horus, the falcon-headed god and protector of pharaohs. Afterward, the cruise will sail to [Kom Ombo](#), where you'll stop to explore the unique Ptolemaic Temple, shared by Sobek and Haroeris, the crocodile gods. Continue sailing towards Aswan, enjoying lunch and dinner onboard, and end the day with an entertaining Nubian show.

**Meals:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

## Day 4: Touring Aswan's sights

Enjoy an open-buffet breakfast before setting off on a tour of Aswan's highlights. Visit the impressive High Dam, built to control the Nile's floodwaters, and see [the Unfinished Obelisk](#) in its granite quarry. Then, explore the beautiful [Philae Temple](#), dedicated to the goddess Isis. Return to the cruise for lunch and dinner onboard, and spend the night in Aswan.

**Meals:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

## Day 5: Stepping off the Nile Cruise at Aswan

The magnificent [Abu Simbel temples](#), constructed by Ramses II for himself and his adored Queen Nefertari, are open for you to see on your last day. Prepare to disembark from the MS Nile Radamis or similar after breakfast. Your tour manager will help you on the final leg of your incredible journey across Egypt—the transfer to the train or [airport in Aswan](#).
