Day 1: Enjoying a Luxor East Bank Tour

During the stint, callers will explore the magnificent Karnak Temple, a vast religious complex that has been erected and expanded over 2,000 times, transubstantiating from a simple sanctum during the New Kingdom into a colossal structure. The tour will also continue to the admiration-inspiring Luxor Temple, which was discovered in 1884 and is positioned on the east bank of the Nile River in Luxor. Overnight lodgment will be handed onboard the Nile Cruise, with the coming day's program to follow. For those interested, a voluntary Sound and Light Show at Karnak Temple can be arranged.

Day 2: Tour to Luxor West Bank

After partaking in a delectable breakfast aboard the MS Royal Viking Nile Cruise, you will be escorted by your tour leader to commence your exploration of Luxor's West Bank. The primary destination will be the renowned Valley of the Kings, where the magnificent rock-cut tombs of the New Kingdom Pharaohs are situated. Additionally, the Luxor West Bank Tour will include a visit to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, also known as the Temple of El Deir El Bahari. This extraordinary 97-foot (30 m) tall monument is capable of captivating its visitors with its unique architectural and artistic merits. The final stop on the day's itinerary will be the Colossi of Memnon, the iconic and imposing statues of the great King Amenhotep III. Following this comprehensive tour, a sumptuous lunch will be served aboard the Luxor to Aswan Nile Cruise, after which you will embark on a sailing journey to Edfu.

An optional and enthralling <u>Luxor Hot Air Balloon Ride</u> above the West Bank monuments is also available for those seeking a bird's-eye view of the region's historical and cultural treasures.

In the evening, you will be treated to a delightful dinner aboard the Nile Cruise, and you will spend the night in Edfu.

Day 3: Exploring Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

Philae Temple:

The tour will continue to the Greco-Roman style <u>Philae Temple</u>, which was dedicated to the worship of the goddess Isis. This temple is one of the four sacred sites associated with the legendary tales of Isis, Osiris, and Horus.

Following the tour, you will be transferred back to the cruise, where you will enjoy a delightful lunch. The afternoon will be free for you to explore Aswan at your own pace. In the evening, a high-quality dinner will be prepared and served aboard the cruise boat, accompanied by an engaging Nubian cultural performance. You will then spend the night in Aswan.

Day 5 : Say Bye from Aswan
