Day 1: Check-in and Aswan sightseeing tour (Friday)

Before setting sail, you will visit the Aswan High Dam, which was built in 1960 to protect Egypt from the excessive floods that occur every year and to supply the necessary electricity for a large country like Egypt.

Resuming your Aswan excursions, you'll see the incredible pillars and engravings of the [Philae Temple](#), which have been preserved for thousands of years and tell the tale of Horus and Osiris as well as other details about how mighty and civilized our forefathers were. The Unfinished Obelisk:

Your Aswan to Luxor Nile Cruise includes a visit to the granite quarries in Aswan to see the largest obelisk in the world, which is also known as the Unfinished Obelisk. Egyptologists believe [Queen Hatshepsut](#) was responsible for its construction because the work was never finished and the obelisk was never used. After that, you'll be taken to the Nile River Cruise.

Day 2: Tour to Kom Ombo Temple - Sailing to Edfu

On your Egypt Nile River Cruise, enjoy a delicious breakfast. We will then set sail for Kom Ombo to continue one of the most unusual Egypt Day Tours. Visit [the Kom Ombo Temple](#), which was constructed during the [Ptolemaic Kingdom](#) of Egypt for God Sobek the crocodile-formed Deity from one entrance, and [Haroeris](#) with its falcon head at the other entrance. There are some exceptionally well-preserved crocodile mummies in the chapel of Sobek, which is located inside the temple. You will be served lunch and dinner on board as you sail to Edfu and spend the night there after your informative tour of Kom Ombo.

Day 3: Tour to Edfu, Karnak, and Luxor Temples

Early in the morning, the Nile cruise ship's breakfast buffet will be opened. The Temple of Horus also referred to as the Temple of Horus at [Edfu](#) is one of the biggest temples from the Ptolemaic era, so take advantage of your time in Egypt by visiting it. One of the ancient Egyptian deities, Horus is symbolized by a male body with a hawk head. He is also known as the god of the sky and the king's protector. Horus is thought to have originated in ancient Egypt. Day 4: Tour to the Valley of the Kings, Hatshepsut Temple, and Colossi of Memnon

The magnificent tombs were carved into the mountain by the most skilled craftsmen in Egyptian history. Then, you will visit El Deir El Bahari Temple, which is also known as the Queen Hatshepsut Temple in Luxor, who was the second female pharaoh and the fifth ruler of the Eighteenth Dynasty.

During the Luxor excursions, we will also show you [the Colossi of Memnon](#), two enormous stone statues of Amenhotep III, after which you will be dropped off at the Luxor Airport or Railway Station in accordance with your preferences.
