It has a sundeck and four decks. See the splendor of Karnak Temple and Luxor Temple during the Luxor East Bank Tours. Luxor is regarded as an outdoor museum. You will be able to see the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut and the Valley of the Kings. We'll stop at Edfu and Kom Ombo temples, the High Dam, and the enormous Temple of Philae, which is situated on Agilika island and is dedicated to Goddess Isis, on the way to Aswan.

Day 1: Aswan City Tour

Your local guide will pick you up early in the morning and drive you in a private air-conditioned vehicle to your Amwaj Living Stone Nile Cruise ship to begin your Aswan Egypt day trips In a short while, we'll be checking in on our yacht. After that, you'll go with our knowledgeable tour guide to the Aswan High Dam, which was built in 1960 by the late Egyptian ruler Gamal Abdel Nasser to save Nile water and generate electricity.

A motorboat will next take us to Agilika Island, where we will explore the <u>Philae Temple</u>, which was constructed in the third century BC during the Greco-Roman era.

Our last stop on this wonderful day tour in Aswan will be the <u>Unfinished Obelisk</u>, which was found close to Aswan.

After the excursion, we'll head back to your Nile Cruise.

Meals: Lunch and dinner.

Day 2: Kom Ombo and Edfu Temples

An invigorating breakfast will be served on the ship. Our Nile Cruise ship will dock in Kom Ombo. Here, we will visit the Temple of Sobek & Haroeris, which was constructed during the Ptolemaic period and finished during the Roman era. This temple was dedicated to two gods, the local crocodile god Sobek and the fabled eagle god Haroeris.

We'll then head back to our yacht to unwind and rest after that. We'll see the best-preserved ancient Egyptian temple in the Nile Valley, the <u>Edfu</u> Temple of Horus.

Later, We'll go back to our yacht after that to spend the night.

Day 3: Luxor West Bank Tour

You can book our optional hot-air balloon ride above the West Bank of Luxor. Have a fantastic brunch before visiting the <u>Valley of the Kings</u>, which is one of Egypt's wealthiest and most fascinating ancient tombs. Here, the kings of the <u>New Kingdom</u> were buried. The second destination on the tour will be the Temple of Deir El Bahari, which was constructed during the reign of Queen Hatshepsut, one of Egypt's finest kings, during the 18th dynasty.

Our journey ends with the <u>Colossi of Memnon</u>, two enormous statues that are all that remain of Amenhotep III's enormous burial temple, which was constructed in 1350 BC and is now known as the Great Pyramid of Amenhotep III.

We'll go back to our cruise after that to spend the night.

Day 4: Luxor East Bank Tour

Check out your Nile Cruise after breakfast. Our next stop will be the east bank of Luxor, where we'll see two beautiful temple complexes. The over-thousand-year-old Karnak Temple Complex will be our first stop. Nearly all of the outstanding items that still exist today are from the new kingdom, particularly the enormous bizarre columns of the hypostyle hall, which were constructed by Ramses II, the greatest architect of ancient Egypt. Next, we'll see the magnificent Luxor Temple, which was also constructed sometime in the 14th century BC and continued for many years by Ramses II, Queen Hatshepsut, and other Pharaohs.

After the journey, we'll take you to your hotel in Luxor.
