Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival at Cairo

At the <u>Cairo International Airport</u>, our tour guide will meet you and drive you in a private vehicle to your hotel.

You will be given a welcome drink when you arrive at the hotel, and our representative will assist you with the check-in processes and go through your itinerary for your 15-day Easter vacation in Egypt in 2023.

Cairo overnight stay.

Day 2: Day Tour to Pyramids and The pyramids of Dahshur

You will begin your journey by having breakfast at the hotel and then visiting the Great <u>Pyramids of</u> <u>Giza</u>, The pyramid of Khufu is made up of more than two million stones, with an average weight of approximately two and a half tons, and some weighing as much as 15 tons. The King's Chamber's roof tiles weigh 45 tons each, and the pyramid's volume is estimated to be around 89 cubic feet, with a total mass of over 6,840,000 tons.

Following that, you will enjoy lunch while admiring the view of the ancient pyramids. Afterward, we will head to Dahshur, which is located near the Giza pyramids. The <u>village of Dahshur</u> is an ancient royal necropolis situated approximately 25 miles (40 kilometers) from Cairo, in the desert on the west bank of the Nile.

Finally, you will be transferred back to your hotel for overnight stay. The meals provided for the day include breakfast and lunch.

Day 3: Museum of Civilization and El Refaai Mosque

After having breakfast and getting ready, we will embark on our next adventure. Our first stop will be at <u>The National Museum of Civilization</u>, where we will pass through The Temporary Exhibition Hall. This hall occupies an area of 1,000 square meters and showcases four crafts - pottery, woodwork, weaving, and jewelry. It displays about 400 artifacts from different eras along with numerous heritage pieces, films, and images that highlight the unique character of Egyptian crafts.

Following that, we will have lunch at a traditional restaurant located nearby. Our tour will then proceed to <u>Sultan Hassan El Refaai Mosque</u>. The mosque was built on the site of the horse market and a palace that Al-Nasir Muhammad bin Qalawun had constructed for Prince Yalbugha Al-Yahawi's residence.

Finally, we will return to the hotel for dinner and an overnight stay.

Day 4: A Visit to Luxor

After breakfast, you will prepare to travel to Luxor. Upon arrival, you will have some time to rest and check-in at a hotel. Our first stop will be a visit to <u>The Karnak Temple</u>. The kings of the Thirtieth Dynasty expanded this temple by adding buildings, erecting statues and obelisks, and presenting gifts and donations to approach God. Some kings even removed the buildings of their predecessors to build their structures in their locations when the temple reached its expansion limit.

Next, we will move on to <u>the Great Temple of Luxor</u>. King Thutmose III established booths for visitors to the holy trinity of Thebes, and Tutankhamun completed the inscriptions on its walls. The triple cabin that had been built earlier during the reign of <u>Queen Hatshepsut</u> and King Thutmose III was destroyed and later rebuilt during the reign of King Ramses II. The temple is also known as "Epet Reset" and is one of the most well-preserved and beautiful Egyptian temples, showcasing the clear layout of an Egyptian temple.

Finally, we will return to the hotel to have lunch and enjoy the nightlife in Luxor.

Day 5: Luxor Attractions

After breakfast, you will visit Luxor's most famous attractions, starting with <u>the Valley of Kings</u>. Tomb No. 63, the last burial chamber discovered in the valley, was found in 2006, and two other entrances were discovered in 2008. The royal tombs are known for their drawings and inscriptions illustrating ancient Egyptian mythology and religious beliefs.

Next, you will pass by the Valley of Queens, where the queens of Pharaonic families were buried. After a break for lunch surrounded by historical places, you will visit el-Deir el-Bahari, where King Mentuhotep Nebhepetre built his temple in a stepped form, inspiring Queen Hatshepsut's temple design.

The tour will continue to <u>the Colossi of Memnon</u>, where the two statues of King Amenhotep III sit on a throne with his wife and mother's small statues and an inscription representing the God of the Nile, with the papyrus plant and lotus linking to the symbols of Delta and Upper Egypt.

Finally, you will return to the hotel to rest after a long day of exploring the ancient wonders of Luxor.

Day 6: Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

The ancient temple of <u>Edfu</u> will be our final stop in Luxor on this day as we conclude our tour. The temple in Edfu, which is regarded as one of the most stunning and comprehensive Egyptian temples due to its extensive integration of elements and plenty of scenes and texts, is what gave the city its fame.

then you'll go to <u>the Kom ombo temple</u>. Notably, the ancient Egyptian physician used a scraper or chisel to cut and remove parts of the head bone, making him the first physician to be able to operate on a living patient. The use of a device called a "Hemm" by ancient Egyptians to measure distances is one of the many fascinating details. Additionally, breakfast, lunch, and dinner are all included.

Day 7: Visit To Aswan Attractions

After breakfast, you will prepare to travel to Aswan in a private air-conditioned car. Our first stop will be <u>The High Dam</u>, which protected Egypt from droughts and famines caused by the Nile River's successive floods. Over the period from 1979 to 1987, approximately 70 billion cubic meters of water were withdrawn from the High Dam Lake to compensate for the annual deficit in the Nile River's natural revenue.

Next, we will visit the unfinished Obelisk, whose purpose for being carved on such a massive scale remains a mystery due to its incomplete state. Some theories suggest that Queen Hatshepsut ordered its construction to demonstrate her strength and solidity.

Our tour in Aswan will end with a sailboat ride to the Nubian Village, with our <u>Egypt Day Tour</u> where the locals showcase their culture, customs, and traditions while preserving their Nubian environment. It is considered one of the most enjoyable destinations in all of Egypt.

Finally, we will return to the hotel in Luxor, and our program includes breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

Day 8: Back To Cairo

After checking out of the hotel, you'll take one of our ready-made cars to the airport to catch your flight back to Cairo International Airport, where you can relax and get some rest before we embark on our next adventure the following day.

Day 9: Fayum Day Tour

After enjoying an Egyptian breakfast, you will prepare for an exciting day in Egypt with the company of a tour guide. You will travel to <u>Fayoum</u>, an Egyptian city and the capital of Fayoum Governorate, via a private van from your hotel in Cairo, which is approximately 105 kilometers southwest of Cairo.

Upon arrival, you will visit <u>the Lake of Qarun</u> or the pond of Qarun, which is one of the largest natural lakes in Egypt, located in Fayoum Governorate. You will learn about its history and significance.

After lunch, your tour guide will take you to the Wadi El Rayan Reserve in the southwestern part of Fayoum Governorate. Wadi El Rayan comprises the upper and lower lakes, the waterfalls area that connects the two lakes, the Uyun al Rayyan area south of the lower lake, and the Jabal al Rayan area, which is the area surrounding the eyes.

Finally, as your driver takes you back to your hotel in Cairo, you will have completed your tour of Fayoum with incredible memories.

Day 10: Bahariya Oasis and The White Desert

After eating breakfast at the hotel, you will go to <u>Bahariya Oasis</u> in our own air-conditioned automobile. The Twenty-sixth Dynasty tombs, the cemetery of sacred birds, the remnants of the Roman Triumphal Arch, the ruins of the Temple of Isis, and the ruins of a temple from Alexander the Great's time are some of the most significant landmarks in Bahariya Oasis. It also has the Valley of the Golden Mummies cemetery.

Day 11: Return to Cairo
