Day 1: Arrival to Cairo and Check in

Upon your flight's arrival at [Cairo International Airport](#), you'll be warmly greeted by a Cairo Top Tours guide. Look for your name on a signboard. They'll accompany you to your hotel, Cairo Pyramids, in a comfortable private air-conditioned vehicle.

After arriving at the hotel, our representative will ensure a seamless check-in process before you settle into your room. Take this time to go over the details of our "Cairo and Alexandria 6-Days Tour Package" itinerary.

Day 2: Tour to Memphis pyramid

Following your breakfast at the hotel, our certified tour guide will join you in the morning lobby to begin your exploration of [Memphis](#) City. The Memphis Pyramid, also recognized as the Great Pyramid of Memphis, stands as an ancient monumental pyramid situated in the Egyptian city of Memphis. Soaring to a height exceeding 140 meters, this pyramid once ranked among the tallest edifices globally.

Among the key highlights of the Memphis Pyramid is the Sphinx, a sizable statue that stands sentinel at the pyramid's entrance. Additionally, you'll have the opportunity to observe the remnants of burial chambers and other unearthed artifacts at the site.

Day 3: The National Museum of Egyptian Civilization Tour

Indulge in your breakfast at the hotel and get ready to continue your Egypt Classic Tours. Your authorized guide will accompany you today to the NMEC.

At the [NMEC](#), you'll be immersed in Egypt's rich history and culture through its vast array of artifacts and displays. Explore galleries featuring ancient Egyptian artistry, including sculptures, jewelry, and pottery. The museum also hosts temporary exhibits shedding light on diverse cultural facets.

A prime attraction at the NMEC is the Royal Mummies Hall, showcasing preserved remains of notable pharaohs and queens like Ramses II and Hatshepsut.

Following this, we'll head to the [Suez Canal](#) in Ismailia. This man-made channel connects the Mediterranean and Red Seas, operational since 1869. Witness ships traversing the canal from observation points along its banks. Boat tours provide an up-close view of the canal's operations. Afterward, savor a delectable seafood lunch before returning to Cairo.

Day 4: Alexandria Day Tour

Embark on an Egypt Classic Tour from Cairo to Alexandria, guided by an English-speaking Egyptologist. The journey begins after breakfast, with a comfortable transfer by air-conditioned vehicle. The approximately 2.5-hour drive offers a break en route.

Alexandria, the Mediterranean's shining pearl and Egypt's second capital was founded by Alexander the Great in 332 B.C.

Catacombs of Kom El Shoqafa: Explore these unique [catacombs](#) where a spiral staircase, encircled by a lowered circular shaft, leads to Roman-style tombs. These multilevel tombs were ingeniously carved underground and used by Christians during times of persecution.

Pompey's Pillar: A renowned landmark "[Pompey's Pillar](#)" was constructed in 297 B.C. to celebrate the victory of Roman Emperor Diocletian. Diocletian's rule spanned Rome (284-305 B.C.) and Egypt.

Bibliotheca of Alexandria: The oldest center of scientific research, founded by Ptolemy I in the early 3rd century B.C. Facing the Mediterranean, it was once the world's largest library.

Citadel of Qaitbay: Positioned at the end of a narrow land extension into the Eastern Port, this [Qaitbay citadel](#) stands on the ruins of the ancient Lighthouse Pharos of Alexandria.

Sidi Morsi Abu al-Abbas Mosque: Discover this beautiful mosque in Alexandria's old city. It showcases intricate architecture and offers insight into local religious customs, showcasing the significance of Islam in Egyptian culture.

The day concludes with a delectable meal of traditional Egyptian cuisine or seafood before retreating to the cozy comfort of Paradise Inn hotel for a night's stay.

Day 5: Visit to the city of El Alamein

El Alamein is renowned for its historical significance, featuring museums, memorials, and cemeteries dedicated to the battles fought there. Notably, the El Alamein War Museum (optional) exhibits artifacts, photos, and personal stories from the conflicts.

The Commonwealth War Cemetery, a poignant site, holds over 7,000 fallen soldiers. Nearby, the German War Cemetery pays homage to the opposing forces.

Beyond its history, [El Alamein War Cemetery](#) offers a picturesque coastal setting with beaches and resorts, making it a charming destination for relaxation, regardless of your interest in WWII history.
