Day 5: Visit to Luxor Attractions

Today's itinerary in Luxor begins with a visit to some of its most renowned attractions. First, we'll explore the [the Valley of Kings](#), a secluded desert valley chosen as the final resting place for kings to protect their tombs from theft. While touring this historic site, you'll marvel at the ancient underground tombs and gain insight into the burial practices of ancient Egyptian royalty.

Next, we'll proceed to the Valley of the [Queens](#), once a significant burial site for queens, princes, and nobles during the 18th and 19th dynasties. Although no longer a royal burial ground after the 20th dynasty, the valley still houses many tombs, some of which have been extensively reused and modified over the centuries.

Afterward, we'll pause for a relaxing lunch amidst these historical wonders.

Following our break, we'll visit [el-Deir el-Bahari](#), a complex of pharaonic temples and tombs located on the west bank of the Nile. Built by Queen Hatshepsut, this architectural marvel served as a monastery for performing rituals intended to benefit her in the afterlife.

Our journey will culminate with a visit to [the Colossi of Memnon](#), two imposing statues that once stood guard at the entrance of an ancient funerary temple dedicated to King Amenhotep III. Dating back to the Eighteenth Dynasty, these colossal statues offer a glimpse into Egypt's rich history and architectural prowess.

Finally, we'll return to the hotel, where you can unwind and reflect on the day's remarkable discoveries.

Day 6: Visit to Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

On this day we will end our tour in Luxor by Visiting [The great temple of Edfu](#) Her ancient religious name was Hadat or Bahdatti, and he was the local god, and he is one of the many deities, one of which is called Horus, and he is called Hor Bahdatti or Horus Edfu, to distinguish between him and Horus, the son of Isis.

then you will Visit [the temple of Komombo](#) The name Kom Ombo is divided into two parts: The first part: “Kum,” which means “hill.” The second part: “embo”, which is a transliteration of “anbu” or “nebo”, meaning “gold”. This is because this city controlled the roads that lead to the gold mines, and the temple was known in Egyptian texts as Pasobek. That is, the headquarters of Sobek, that place in which he was worshiped since pre-dynastic times, and this temple is located on a very high hill, overlooking the Nile River.

And all the meals breakfast, lunch and dinner are included.

Day 7: Aswan Attractions

After enjoying breakfast, prepare for a journey to Aswan in our comfortable, air-conditioned vehicles, where you'll explore the High Dam. The origins of dam construction near Aswan trace back to the 11th century AD, when the engineer Ibn al-Haytham was called upon by the Fatimid caliph to manage the Nile's floods. Carved from pink granite, the obelisk stands as the longest Egyptian obelisk, towering at 42 meters in length and weighing around 1,000 tonnes, displaying noticeable cracks on its surface.

Our tour of Aswan concludes with a visit to the Nubian village. Originating around a century ago, during the construction of the ancient Aswan reservoir between 1902 and 1912, the village was established on a sandy slope on the west bank of the river, near Suhail Island, providing residents with safety from the yearly floods.

Return to the hotel in Luxor.

Day 8: Travel Back To Cairo

Day 9: Fayum Day Tour

Start your day with a traditional Egyptian breakfast and prepare for an exciting adventure in Egypt, accompanied by our knowledgeable tour guide.

Depart from your hotel in Cairo in a private van and enjoy a leisurely drive of 105 kilometers southwest to Fayoum. Fayoum is an Egyptian city, serving as the capital of Fayoum Governorate, with two residential neighborhoods divided by the Bahr Youssef Canal. Upon arrival, begin your exploration by visiting [Lake of Qarun](#), also known as the Pond of Qarun. This natural lake, situated in Fayoum, is one of the largest in Egypt and offers insight into its rich history.

Afterwards, take a break to enjoy lunch before continuing your journey.

Next, your tour guide will lead you to Wadi El Rayan Reserve, located in the southwestern part of Fayoum Governorate. Wadi El Rayan comprises the upper lake, lower lake, waterfalls area connecting the two lakes, Uyun al Rayyan area south of the lower lake, and Jabal al Rayan area surrounding the eyes.

As your driver returns you to your hotel in Cairo, you will have completed your tour, enriched with memorable experiences.

Day 10: Visit To Bahariya Oasis and The White Desert

After enjoying breakfast at the hotel, you will embark on a journey to Bahariya Oasis in our private air-conditioned car. Situated in the Western Desert of Egypt, [Bahariya Oasis](#) belongs to the Giza Governorate and lies approximately 365 kilometers southwest of Giza. It is accessible via the Cairo-Wahat Desert Road, connecting it to Giza and Greater Cairo. Spanning over 2,000 square kilometers, the oasis is home to around 400 springs, offering both warm and cold mineral and sulfur water. The central city of the oasis is Bawiti.

Continuing our exploration, we will head to [The White Desert](#), characterized by its stunning white landscapes covering most of its area, totaling 3010 square kilometers. The White Desert is a protected natural landscape renowned for its karst formations, making it a fascinating open museum for studying desert environments. We will set up camp there for the night, surrounded by the serene beauty of the desert.

Throughout the program, breakfast, lunch, and dinner will be provided to ensure your comfort and satisfaction.

Day 11: Back to Cairo

After a memorable night in the desert, we will return to Cairo, where you can relax with a refreshing shower and spend the day at the hotel or in your room, according to your preference.
