## Day 1: Arrive in Cairo

Take a tour of your hotel, take in the scenery, sample some local cuisine, and ask the guide any questions you may have.

The Giza Pyramids were built during the Fourth Dynasty of the Old Kingdom in ancient Egypt and are considered to be one of the best things to do in Cairo. The sphinx leaves people dazzled and surprised that it has a human head and a lion's body.

#### Day 4: Continue Along to The Valley of Kings.

You will visit <u>The Valley of the Kings</u> is one of the most beautiful sites in Luxor and contains the royal tombs of our great kings. The first king to be buried there was King Tutmosis I of the 18th dynasty. It is also known as the Valley of the Gates of the Kings and is located in the southern part of Egypt. The tombs are rock-cut tombs.

### Day 5: Visit Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

We'll visit <u>Edfu's Temple</u> of Horus, which is the most impressive structure honoring Horus, the falconheaded god of the sky and kingship who was worshipped in ancient Egypt. You will then sail to <u>Kom Ombo</u>. The temple is of the post-pharaonic era, of the same period as those of Esna and Edfu Temple. It was probably built on the foundations of a previous structure. The entrance pylon was added later by the Roman emperor Augustus, around 30 B.C.

### Day 6: Travel to Aswan & See the Philae temple

Again, with the travel moments that are never forgotten, you will be ready to go to the beautiful <u>Aswan</u> and see the temples that have unique architecture. We hope to see you smile there and feel the moment.

You will visit the Philae temple. The risky salvage campaign done by UNESCO to relocate the magnificent Philae temple of Goddess Isis to a higher and safer island was completed, carefully maintaining and imitating the original shape and layout of the complex and even landscaping the island to match its former location.

# Day 8: Tour the Catacombs, Roman Amphitheater & National Museum of Alexandria.

You will visit the catacombs of Kom el Shoqafa are one of the most effective anthropological sites in Alexandria. These tombs were excavated within the mother rock at the time of Emperor Aurelius, within the second century A.D. Then The National Museum of Alexandria to take photos for memories.

# Day 9: Visit the Bibliotheca Alexandria, Citadel of Qaitbey, and Montazah Palace Gardens.

Visiting <u>Bibliotheca Alexandria</u> was the world's largest library; it was established by King Ptolemy I and housed about 900,000 manuscripts throughout his reign. Then, you will visit the Citadel of Qaitbey, which was built in the 15th century on Pharos Island, where the <u>Pharos Lighthouse of Alexandria</u> stood. It was built on the ruins of the ancient Lighthouse of Alexandria, and, at last, <u>Montazah Palace Gardens</u>.
