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Day 1: Arrival in Cairo, Check-in

Your representative will meet you at [the Cairo International Airport](#) upon arrival and drive you to your hotel where you can check in and unwind after a tiring flight. Take a tour of the Great Giza Pyramids, one of the seven wonders of the world, to start your day. These pyramids have stood for countless years, enduring wars, earthquakes, and even the passage of time to continue to be one of Egypt's most well-known tourist destinations. They are also thought to be the tombs of Khufu, Khafre, and Menkaure, three pharaohs.

The most well-known of these was built for Queen Hetepheres, mother of [King Khufu](#) and wife of King Senefru. She also owned the renowned collection of artifacts that is now on display at the Egyptian Museum. There are several small pyramids built to house the mummies of kings' wives and mothers.

Next up is a visit to [the Egyptian Museum](#) in Cairo. The museum houses over 120,000 items from all periods in Egypt's long history From prehistory through modern times—and includes everything from artifacts from everyday life to ancient religious objects.

Day 2: Alexandria sightseeing Tour

Today, you'll travel from Cairo to [Alexandria](#), a city known for its ancient history dating back to Alexander the Great and beautiful beaches. The tour begins at nine in the morning with a drive to Alexandria, where your local guide will pick you up to begin your city tour. Fort Qaitbey, which Sultan Qaitbey erected in 1480 on an island in the Mediterranean Sea, will be your first stop. At a height of about 10 meters above sea level, the fort provides one of the best vistas of Alexandria, looking down on both the city and its well-known seafront promenade.

After that, you will go to see some other sights in Alexandria such as Pompey's Pillar (a huge ancient Roman column standing on top of a hill), and Pompey's Pillar Museum (the oldest museum in the world). You will go to the 280 BC [Kom El-Shuqafa Catacombs](#), an underground graveyard. As part of our trip, we'll also stop by the Coptic Museum to view its collection of Coptic artwork and artifacts, which includes some of the oldest surviving works of Christian literature.

After that, we'll take a walk along the Corniche to see some of the city's beautiful architecture and monuments. Then it's time for lunch at one of Alexandria's many seafood restaurants before returning to Cairo.

Day 3: Fly to Luxor, East Bank Tour

You'll arrive in Luxor by plane, eat breakfast at your hotel, and then be picked up by your guide to start the day. The East Bank of the Nile, also referred to as the "city of the dead," will be the subject of a full-day tour. You'll go to [the Karnak Temple](#), one of Egypt's biggest and most impressive temples. Having been in use for more than three thousand years, it is an intriguing location to explore. The complex consists of four principal temples honoring Amun, Mut, Montu, and Ptah.

Following your visit to the Karnak Temple, you will proceed to [the Luxor Temple](#), another magnificent ancient structure. Given the size of the temple complex and the labyrinthine layout of its rooms and corridors, getting lost is simple. However, that's a big part of what makes it so unique!

Day 4: Luxor West Bank tour

You'll be picked up for an excursion to the West Bank after breakfast, where you'll see a number of tombs, including those of King Tuthmosis II, Ramses III, and [Seti I](#). Additionally, you'll have time to visit Nefertari and Queen Kiya's tombs. The Valley of the Kings will be our first stop on the tour.

It is a royal necropolis where you can see the tombs of some Pharaohs as well as other nobles. You will then visit one of the most famous temples in Egypt - Hatshepsut Temple which is dedicated to Amun-Re, Mut, Khonsu, and Hathor. It was built by [Queen Hatshepsut](#) who ruled during [the 18th dynasty](#) in honor of Amun-Re, Mut, and Khonsu in around 1460 BC. From there, we will take you to see Deir el-Bahri where there are many temples including those of Hatshepsut (the largest), Tuthmosis III, and Ramesses II. Afterward, we will visit Medinet Habu Temple built by Ramses III as well as other smaller temples in the area.
