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Day1- Cairo: Egyptian Museum, Pyramids & Bazaar Tour

You will be picked up by your tour guide in the hotel lobby and driven to the Pyramids, Sphynxes, and Egyptian Museum. [The Giza Pyramids](#), one of the Seven Wonders of the World, ought to be your first destination. Savor the magnificent views of the [Mycinerus](#), Chephren, and Cheops Pyramids. Next, stop to get some photos with the magnificent [Great Sphinx](#). You are allowed to pay for your own travel expenses to see the Great Pyramid. The next action is to go to a local restaurant and try some Egyptian food.

After this, you'll go to [the Egyptian Museum](#). These vast exhibitions contain more than 250,000 items spanning more than 5,000 years of history. Then, if you'd like, you can explore King Tutankhamun's chamber—which is adorned with vibrant jewels and gold—at your own expense. During an excavation in 1920, these magnificent artifacts that had been stored in the King's tomb for 3,500 years were discovered.

At last, you'll arrive at [the Khan el-Khalili](#) Bazaar, where you can experience the atmosphere of a neighborhood market within the historic district. See the extensive array of locally made jewelry, antiques, and mementos for sale as you explore this historic souk (market). After exploring all that Egypt has to offer, return to your hotel to round off your vacation.

Day 2: Desert and Bahariya Oasis Day Trip

We traveled the 340 kilometers in our van from Cairo to [the Oasis Bahariya](#) early in the morning. Bahariya is the closest oasis to Cairo, with 398 mineral and sulfur springs that are well-known for their therapeutic qualities and some with temperatures as high as 45 degrees.

Black hills composed of ferruginous quartzite and dolerite flank Bahariya. reach the capital of the Oasis, [Bawiti](#), perched on a hillside. You will have lunch at your CAMP. After lunch, you'll start your journey to [the Black Desert](#), which is close to Bahariya Oasis. One of the reasons for the black rocks in the desert is iron.

You will first hike Gabal el Marsos (Divided Mountain) before taking a car to the small Bedouin community of El Hez. After making stops at [Agabat](#) el Sharkia and El Santa tree, Crystal Mountain, you will travel 160 km on an off-road route to reach the White Desert. The chalky, cream-colored landscape of the White Desert is well-known, as are the wind-carved mushroom-shaped formations that resemble both animal and human features.

As we head through the White Desert to our hotel in the Bahariya Oasis for dinner and a break, you can take in the stunning desert sunset. The program will conclude with a trip back to Cairo.

Day 3: Cairo to Alexandria

At 7:00 am, you will be picked up from your Cairo or Giza lodging for the 220 km drive to Alexandria. Set out on your day trip from [Alexandria](#) at 10 a.m., with a stop at the Roman Theater (a theater with 800 marble seats, galleries, a section of mosaic flooring, and a pleasure garden surrounded by Roman Villas & baths).

Next, you will proceed to [Kom El-Catacomb](#), Shoqafa's triple-level mausoleum featuring the Tri-cilium, where relatives used to sit on stone benches to honor the departed. Within are second-century Roman armored sculptures of Sobec and Anubis.

After that, have a free stroll along the Cornish at [El Mursi Abu Elabas](#), [Qaytbay Citadel](#), and [Alexandria Library](#). After the excursion, you will be returned to Cairo. You should return to Cairo around 9:00 p.m.

Lunch is provided at a nearby restaurant in between visits; drinks are not.

Day 4: Final Departure

Following breakfast, you check out of your Cairo hotel and our tour guide picks you up to take you to the international Cairo airport.
