

Day 1- Welcome onboard/Visit Top Highlights of Aswan

It's time to experience the legendary Nile River in luxury by being picked up from your location in Aswan by a modern private air-conditioned vehicle to join your personal tour guide to visit [Aswan High Dam](#). It's one of the most significant achievements in Egypt in recent times, completed in 1970, and its importance extended to being the controller of the Nile floods and the main generator of 50% of electricity. Then you will go to [the Unfinished Obelisk](#), an ancient Egyptian ruin dating back to the reign of [Queen Hatshepsut](#), but the site was abandoned due to some cracks. We will take you to discover [Philae Temple](#). It's a cult temple whose construction was based on the worship of the god Isis. At this point, you will be taken to check in on the 5-star luxury Merit Dahabiya Nile Cruise, where your lunch will be followed by an overnight stay in Aswan.

Day 2- Nile cruise trip to Kom Ombo & Edfu Temples

Your Nile cruise departs from Aswan early in the morning while you enjoy breakfast on board. Upon arrival in [Kom Ombo](#), you will meet your private tour guide to explore the temple there, which is regarded as one of the most important Ptolemaic structures in Egypt because it was built as a dual dedication temple for the gods [Sobek](#) and [Horus](#).

After that, have an open buffet lunch before continuing your cruise to Edfu to see [the Edfu Temple](#), where the pharaoh's annual celebration of coronation honoring the holy birth of Horus was held. You will cruise to Luxor, reach there late at night, and then spend the rest of the day on the ship's deck.

Day 3- Nile cruise trip to the best of Luxor Highlights

On the third day onboard the Alexander the Great Nile cruise, you will join your tour guide to visit the magnificent monuments of Luxor, including the [Temple of Queen Hatshepsut](#). It's a magnificent Theban religious and funerary temple situated on the west bank of the Nile River, and the site comprises tombs and buildings dating from the Middle Kingdom to the Ptolemaic period. Then, you will head to the [Valley of the Kings](#); it's the site of the royal burials of the pharaohs of the New Kingdom, which were constructed in 2100 BC. Before you proceed to [Colossi of Memnon](#), the site contains two faceless sculptures representing Amenhotep III and rises around 18 meters on the west bank of the Nile. Let's have a marvelous trip to [Karnak Temple](#), where lunch and dinner will be served onboard the MeritDahabiyaa Nile cruise and overnight in Luxor.

Day 4- Check Out and End Your Trip

After you have checked out, we will take you to your hotel in Luxor or another location in the city where you choose to terminate your Nile boat excursion.
