You will be taken to the Egyptian Museum, which has two stories and houses the largest collection of Egyptian artifacts in existence, as well as the one-of-a-kind golden treasure that was unearthed undamaged in the Valley of the Kings and was formerly owned by the young king Tutankhamun. He is one of the Egyptian family's eighteen parishioners, dating back to ancient Egypt. Tutankhamun, like many other pharaohs, is among the most well-known for reasons unrelated to his accomplishments or the victories he had in combat.

After that, we'll begin our [tour of Coptic Cairo](#) by going to the ancient Roman fortification of Babylon and [the Hanging Church](#), which is perched above the fort's two towers. You will visit Ben Ezra Synagogue, which is a historic Jewish synagogue situated in Old Cairo and Abu Serga Church.

Enjoy your meal at a reputable Egyptian eatery. After seeing the most well-known mosques constructed during the Islamic era and [Khan El Khalili](#), Cairo's historic bazaar. After finishing your Islamic Cairo tour, we will transfer you again to your hotel.

[The Unfinished Obelisk](#), also known as the Incomplete Sink, is a pink granite engraved obelisk, the longest Egyptian obelisk, with a length of up to 42 meters, a weight of about 1,000 tons, and its name The Incomplete Obelisk is due to the fact that its construction has not been completed, as there is a large crack in its surface.
