Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival in Cairo

Enjoy your first morning in Cairo after arriving from Port Said with the assistance of our representatives.

With your amazing tour guide, you will go to these sites in the City of Cairo:

The Pyramids of Giza: This magnificent construction, the last standing example of the original bending 'Seven Wonders of the World', has stood still for over four thousand five hundred years within the sands of time. It consists of a trio of famous pyramids that were all constructed for the Great kings during the civilization's 4th dynasty and were used as their tombs.

The Great Sphinx: This is a large stone figure of a lion with the head of a man said to be commissioned for Pharaoh Chephren. It is a well-known stone-edged figure located at the Giza cemetery, where the figure shields from the onlookers the valuable possessions inside the tombs.

The Valley Temple: Located to the east of the pyramid of Chephren, this temple, which also served the Fourth Dynasty Pharaoh Chephren, is the funerary temple for many fourth-dynasty pharaohs and nobles.

Devouring an appropriate and rich lunch is rather significant because it helps you to prepare for, firstly,

Saqqara Step Pyramid: This is the earliest pyramid in the universe and the first step pyramid to ever be constructed in history. Belonging to the 3rd Dynasty, this pyramid belonged to King Djoser and had six magnificent tiers.

You will spend the night at a comfortable hotel in Cairo.

Day 2: Old Cairo and transfer to Alexandria

On the second day of the tour, you will have a delightful breakfast at the hotel before your guide takes you to visit:

The Museum of Egyptian Antiquities: This museum has one of the most expansive exhibitions of centuries-old historical items over 3000 years ago, in which case it possesses a lot of ancient items, even if they existed unearthed. You'd swear you had traveled back in time, more so because of the collection of King Tutankhamun's objects, which are without comparison.

After lunch in a local eatery, the tour will proceed to include the following places:

Salah Ed-Din Citadel: This fortress was constructed between the years 1176 and 1183 AD under the leadership of Salah Ad-Din El Ayyubi. This fort served its purpose well, acting as a bulwark for the country against any threats from outside.

The mosque of Muhammad Ali: Built between 1830 and 1848 inside the Citadel of Cairo, this mosque ranks among the most visited Islamic structures in Egypt. It was built in honor of Muhammad Ali, who reigned as the king of conquerors, and boasts exquisite patterns and architecture.

Egyptian Museum: Get ready for a thrilling excursion that will let you appreciate the beauty of Egypt's past and present, and this covers over four thousand five hundred years.

Khan El Khalili Bazaar: And the last part of this trip will include one of the best shopping experiences in the Middle East with all sorts of clothes, spices, perfumes, etc. in one of the oldest bazaars. Later, you will be driven to Alexandria, where our services will end.
