The Nubian Museum:

The Nubian Museum has three floors: the basement houses the main exhibition hall, restoration laboratories, workshops, antiquities stores, a welcome center, and an open theatre. The bottom floor houses the main entrance, an exhibition hall, a lecture hall, a VIP hall, security and administration offices, and the museum's general manager's room.

The Philae Temple:

The name "Philai" comes from the Greek word "Philai," which means "beloved," and it was known in Arabic literature as "Anas al-Wujud," referring to the legend of Anas al-Wujud in the folklore stories "One Thousand and One Nights." The ancient Egyptian and Coptic names are "Bilak," which means the terminus or the end, as it was Egypt's southernmost frontier.
