Day Tour to Saqqara Necropolis from Cairo

A Day Tour from Cairo to Saqqara Necropolis, located 30 kilometers north of Cairo, provides an intriguing peek into ancient Egyptian history. The Step Pyramid, the earliest known pyramid, was built by Djoser, a great ruler. Visitors may examine King Teti's Pyramid and Unas' Pyramid, the final King of the Fifth Dynasty. The Nobles' tombs, such as Kagemini's, represent daily life events in ancient Egypt, including plant harvesting, fishing, trapping, and animal blessing.

The Imhotep Museum, one of numerous galleries containing over 500 unique objects, displays the Zoser funeral collection as well as a full cemetery with a mummy, wooden coffin, pottery, and cooking pots. A tasty lunch is given at a local restaurant, and an official tour guide can take travelers to government-authorized bazaars to learn about ancient Egyptian craftsmen and purchase souvenirs to commemorate your Egypt excursions.
