Itinerary

Day 1 : Arrive Cairo - Start your Cairo, Oases and Nile Cruise Travel Package

Upon your arrival at Cairo International Airport, a Cairo Top Tours manager will be there to greet you. You'll be escorted to your hotel in a comfortable private vehicle. Our representative will assist with your check-in process and provide details on your upcoming Desert Safari tours in Egypt. Enjoy your overnight stay in Cairo.

A complimentary welcome drink will be provided at the hotel.

Day 2: Giza Pyramids - Cairo Tours

After a delicious breakfast, you'll embark on a visit to the Giza Plateau to explore the iconic Great Pyramid of King Khufu, along with the Pyramids of Khafre and Menkaure. These monumental structures, built during the Fourth Dynasty between 2589 and 2504 B.C., will be brought to life by your knowledgeable Egyptologist, who will explain their construction and significance. You'll then ascend to a vantage point offering panoramic views of the entire necropolis. For those interested, camel rides at the Giza Pyramids are available as an optional activity and can be easily arranged onsite.

Next, you'll visit the legendary Sphinx, a magnificent statue with the head of a man and the body of a lion, symbolizing strength and wisdom. Nearby, you'll explore the Valley Temple, where the mummification of the king, likely King Khafre, took place before his burial. The tour continues with a visit to the Egyptian Museum, home to the treasures of the young pharaoh Tutankhamun. Located in the heart of Cairo, near Tahrir Square, this museum is one of the most renowned in the world.

Your journey then takes you to Coptic Cairo, situated in the Masr Al-Qadima district, an area rich in history and archaeology. You'll start with a visit to the Roman fortress of Babylon and the Hanging Church, dedicated to the Virgin Mary and a significant site for the Coptic Orthodox community. You'll also see the Church of St. Sergius and Bacchus, often referred to as the Cavern Church, before heading to the Ben Ezra Synagogue, a revered site in Jewish history.

After lunch, you'll be driven to Islamic Cairo, where you'll explore the vibrant Khan El Khalili bazaar. Located in the Al-Hussein district, this bustling market is one of the oldest in Cairo and a highlight of Islamic Cairo tours.

Finally, you'll return to your hotel for an overnight stay in Cairo.

Day 3: Cairo - Bahariya Oasis Trip

Rise and shine! After enjoying your daily breakfast, you will check out of your hotel in Cairo at 6:00 AM to embark on an exciting Egypt Desert Safari adventure. A professional guide will be waiting to whisk you away in a deluxe vehicle for the approximately 4-hour drive to the stunning Bahariya Oasis.

Once you arrive, your first stop will be the Museum of Golden Mummies, where you will have the opportunity to marvel at the mummies coated in gold. This remarkable display provides a glimpse into the ancient funerary practices of the Bahariya Oasis during the 26th dynasty.

Next, you will visit the Tombs of the Nobles, the final resting place of the administrators who oversaw the Bahariya Oasis during the same era. Nearby, you will find the impressive Temple of Alexander the Great, where the great ruler himself is depicted presenting offerings to the revered Egyptian deity, Amun-Re, who was worshipped extensively in the Bahariya Oasis during the Greco-Roman period. This temple may serve as a memorial to Alexander the Great's journey through the oasis on his way to the Oracle Temple in the Siwa Oasis.

Continuing your exploration, you will visit the Temple of Meftella, located near the village of Al-Qasr. This site derives its name from the nearby spring called Meftella, which lies to the northeast of the cemeteries.

Midday, you will enjoy a delicious lunch served by the hospitable Bedouins in a traditional Bedouin house, providing you with an authentic taste of local culture.

After your meal, you will have the opportunity to relax at your hotel and enjoy the refreshing pool. As the sun begins to set, you will embark on a thrilling 4WD Jeep excursion to the Black Mountain, where you can climb to the top and marvel at the breathtaking panoramic view of the Bahariya Oasis.

With a full day of adventure behind you, you will settle in for an overnight stay in Bahariya, surrounded by the captivating desert landscape.

Day 4: White and Black Deserts Tour

After a refreshing breakfast, you'll embark on a journey to explore the captivating natural wonders of the Bahariya Oasis. First, you'll visit the serene salt lake and the enchanting palm tree-lined fruit

fields, savoring the tranquility of these picturesque landscapes.

Next, you'll travel approximately 170 km south to the remarkable White Desert. This unique desert landscape is aptly named, as it is adorned with a stunning white color that covers much of its expansive 3010 square kilometer area. The reserve is renowned for its large, chalky rock formations, which have been sculpted into fascinating shapes by the occasional sandstorms that sweep through the region.

On your way to the White Desert, you'll pass through the Black Desert, a dramatic landscape of volcanic hills that erupted centuries ago, creating a striking contrast with the surrounding terrain. You'll also visit the Valley of El Haize, the southernmost village in Bahariya, known for its extraordinary natural breezes.

One of the highlights of your journey will be a stop at Crystal Mountain, a charming and beautiful area in the heart of the Farafra Oasis. This unique destination is renowned for its stunning quartz crystal formations and its high environmental value, offering a magnificent view that will leave a lasting impression.

Continuing your adventure, you'll venture into the magnificent Valley of Agabat, a place of magical beauty that will captivate your senses.

As the day draws to a close, you'll settle into your campsite in the heart of the White Desert, surrounded by mesmerizing limestone formations, including the iconic rabbit and mushroom shapes. Here, you'll enjoy a delicious Bedouin-style dinner, immersing yourself in the tranquility and wonder of this remarkable desert landscape.

Day 5: Farafra Oasis - Dakhla Oasis Trip

Refreshed from your night in the enchanting White Desert, you'll embark on another day of exploration, this time heading to the captivating Farafra Oasis. This small oasis, dating back to the Pharaonic era, is located approximately 170 km south of the Bahariya Oasis and 627 km southwest of Cairo.

Upon arrival in Farafra, you'll have the opportunity to take a dip in the soothing hot waters of the Bir Setah hot spring. You'll also visit the unique mud brick museum of local artist Badr, where you can marvel at modern art artefacts and gain a deeper appreciation for the region's creative spirit.

Continuing your journey, you'll travel to the ancient town of Al Qasr, located in the heart of the Egyptian desert and known as one of the oldest archaeological cities. This historic site was a significant meeting point for ancient transportation routes.

From Al Qasr, you'll drive for about 3 hours to reach the Roman Temple of Deir El Hagar, one of the smallest temples in Egypt. Constructed during the era of the Roman Emperor Nero, this sandstone temple is adorned with intricate carvings and inscriptions representing the Pharaonic creed, dedicated to the worship of the gods Amun, Mut, and Khonsu.

Next, you'll visit the stunning Roman burial ground of Muzzawaqa, where you'll have the opportunity to explore some of Egypt's most beautiful rock-cut tombs. In the afternoon, you'll have time to relax by the pool, before exploring the lush Dakhla Oasis, with its clear blue skies and golden dunes. As the day draws to a close, you'll witness the breathtaking sunset on the edge of the Great Sand Sea, while sipping on a delicious Bedouin tea.

Your day will culminate with an overnight stay at a desert lodge atop a cliff in Dakhla, offering you a panoramic view of the verdant village embraced by the dunes and the stunning pink rose mountains that make this oasis so captivating.

Day 6: Kharga Oasis Tour

Energized by your breakfast, you'll embark on a journey to the largest of the Oases, El Kharga, located 232 km south of Assiut. As the capital of the New Valley Governorate, El Kharga is a hub of ancient monuments, natural springs, and captivating tourist attractions.

Your first stop will be the ancient Roman fortress of Qasr El Labkha, dating back to the 5th century AD. You'll then visit the Kharga Museum, which houses a fascinating collection of artifacts from the Pharaonic, Ptolemaic, Roman, and Christian eras.

Next, you'll be transported to the Roman Temple of Hibis & Nadora, established during the reign of the Roman Emperors Antoninus Pius or Hadrian. Continuing your exploration, you'll visit the ancient cemetery of Bagawat, known for its chapels adorned with well-preserved biblical decorations from the Old Testament, showcasing the rich cultural heritage of the area.

After a delicious lunch, you'll move on to the Baris Oasis, which dates back to 5000 BC and was built to honor Serapis, the Greek god. Here, you'll visit the Temple of Dush, a former Roman settlement that operated as a city in the middle of a thriving community, securing the forty-day road when it was in use. You'll have the opportunity to see the remnants of the residential area with mud-brick houses, as well as the fortress dedicated to the goddess Isis and the god Serapis.

As the day draws to a close, you'll embark on a unique overnight camping experience in the middle of the golden dunes of the Kharga Oasis, immersing yourself in the serene and captivating beauty of the Egyptian desert.

Day 7: Kharga to Luxor - East Bank Tours
